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### Resource - Primary and Parents - Lego Build and Talk

Lego, makers of those plastic bricks that really hurt when you step on them, have created some wonderful activities for children aged 6-9 years which I think would be very useful for parents and the classroom. There are six different topics which are designed to help children navigate the online world safely, including conversation starters. The topics include cyber bullying, screen time, false information and others. All the activities and resources are free. See [HERE](#) for further information.

### Resource - Secondary/College - TikTok Adverts, Creators and You

This free resource from MediaSmart, which includes a SEND version, is a film-based resource featuring successful TikTok creators to understand and navigate the commercial side of TikTok to promote a positive online experience. ### Primary and Secondary - The Annual Cybersurvey

The Cybersurvey has been a hugely valuable source of academic research into the online lives of many thousands of young people within the UK since 2016. This year there is a primary version available too. The research looks at the responses from children and young people themselves, which then allows professionals to target specific areas of concern which includes: racism, wellbeing, online harms, bullying, hate, sexism, their view of online safety education and much more.

### DfE - AI in Education Policy Statement

On 26th October the Department for Education updated their policy paper about the use of generative artificial intelligence in education. Generative AI refers to models which have been trained on volumes of data and which is capable of producing data such as text or images, think ChatGPT, Google Bard and Microsoft Bing.

DfE seem to be taking a positive stance which I think is good, for example reducing teacher workload, but also

highlights and warns of problems such as intellectual property/copyright rights, accuracy of data, data protection and more whether AI is being used by teachers/staff or by students. For example, quote Education institutions must not allow or cause pupils' work to be used to train generative AI models unless they have appropriate consent..... unquote.

I feel this is going to be a steep (but necessary) learning curve for many, but we are very much on the brink of a new era of technology, both positively and negatively.

### **For DSL's (all key stages) - Report Remove Tool Explainer**

I cannot stress how important it is for young people and professionals to know about and understand the Childline/IWF Report Remove Tool. We know that instances of self-generated illegal imagery is increasing significantly. We know that children and young people are unlikely to report to a trusted adult for a variety of reasons. But the Report Remove tool can be used by children themselves, or with the help of a parent/professional. The NSPCC have a 24 minute explainer video on YouTube which I think would really help DSL's to understand more about the tool, what it is and how it can be use.

## STAFF INSET

There is a primary version plus a secondary/college version, the most recent videos were updated and re-recorded at the end of August 2023 to make sure they're right up to date. They take staff through the risk basics (content, contact, conduct and commerce), the spaces that children occupy online (games, YouTube and social media) plus the latest risks and issues with supporting advice and guidance. The video can be streamed or downloaded to the school network.

## PARENTS

## GOVERNORS/TRUSTEES
