Our values are taken from the work of Neville Norcross ‘Christian Values for Church Schools’. Whilst there are many Christian values, we have chosen the six above to complement our commitment to a rich curriculum and outstanding pastoral care.

Philosophy

As a Christian community we have created a uniform policy that is designed to allow all students to attend school without worrying about how their appearance may set them apart from their peers. We wish to have a fellowship of young people dressing and conforming to the school’s expectations in a dignified manner.

Statement of intent

Bishop Rawstorne C of E Academy is committed to safeguarding and promoting the physical, mental and emotional welfare of every student, both inside and outside of the school premises. We implement a whole-school preventative approach to managing safeguarding concerns, ensuring that the wellbeing of students is at the forefront of all action taken.

INTRODUCTION

Students are ambassadors of the school and, as such, are expected to dress and behave in a way that reflects our high standards. At Bishop Rawstorne we believe that our uniform policy benefits the school in a number of ways:

- It plays an important role in promoting the ethos of the school and is strongly encouraged by the DfE
- It provides a sense of belonging and identity, nurturing the notion of community
- It protects students from social pressures to dress in a particular way and encourages equality
- It supports discipline and good behaviour
- It instils a sense of pride in the school
- It promotes more effective teaching and learning
- It ensures the health and safety of students and staff

The uniform should be smart with all items clearly labelled with the student name. If students are unable to wear the uniform for any reason, the school must be notified in writing with a supporting medical note. Under no circumstances will we tolerate clothing which is not in line with our dress code. The highest standards of uniform should be adhered to en route to and from school.

BOYS' SCHOOL UNIFORM

Blazer:	Plain blue with school crest
Shirt:	Plain white not fitted
Trousers:	Plain steel grey with school crest (crests cannot be transferred and trousers should be obtained from the supplier)
Jumper (Optional):	Plain navy-blue v-neck with school crest (optional)
Tie:	School clip-on tie with school crest (Year 11 wear a blue or senior prefect tie)
Shoes:	Low-heeled, black, sensible. No boots or trainers. Laces must be tied.
Socks:	Plain black or navy socks –white socks are not permitted
Scarves:	Plain dark coloured - to be worn in inclement weather only

GIRLS' SCHOOL UNIFORM

Blazer:	Plain blue with school crest
Shirt:	Traditional plain white school blouse/shirt with buttons to collar - not fitted
Skirt:	Plain steel grey pleated skirt with school crest and undershorts steel grey (crests cannot be transferred and skirts should be obtained from the supplier)
Trousers:	Plain steel grey (trousers should be obtained from the supplier)
Jumper:	Plain navy-blue V-neck with school crest (Optional)
Tie:	School clip-on tie with school crest (Year 11 wear a blue or senior prefect tie)
Shoes:	Low-heeled, black, sensible. No boots or trainers. Laces must be tied.
Socks	Plain black or navy socks only - white socks are not permitted
Tights	Navy or black tights may be worn (Socks or tights to be worn, but not both)
Scarves:	Plain dark coloured –to be worn in inclement weather only

BOYS'-PE KIT

Indoors:	Red shirt with school crest Navy blue shorts or navy-blue tracksuits Red, knee-high training socks Training shoes (clean - non-marking soles)
Outdoors:	Navy blue ½ zip top Astroturf trainers (if clean & non-marking can be used instead of training shoes) Football boots

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GIRLS' PE KIT

Indoors:	Red shirt with school crest Navy blue shorts or navy-blue tracksuit bottoms or navy skirt Red, knee-high training socks Training shoes (clean, non-marking soles)
Outdoors:	Navy blue ½ zip top Astroturf trainers (if clean & non-marking can be used instead of training shoes) Shin pads and mouth guard

For 2026-27 we have tendered and moved to a new uniform supplier, and in light of the new legislation related to school uniform, made some small changes to the uniform. The changes are as follows:

- Badges removed from PE shorts, PE tracksuit bottoms, PE ¼ zip top.
- Change of colour to steel grey for boys' trousers, girls' trousers and school skirts.

As a result, in 2026-27 there are transition arrangements in place to support families. Students can continue to wear the badged PE kit for as long as it lasts, there is no need to replace it immediately.

Year 11 can continue to wear the blue school skirts and black trousers for their final year, as long as they continue to fit. Please note that skirts must meet the length requirements.

All other year groups have a transition period, into the spring term (12 months from notification of the change) to move to the new colour trousers or skirts. All other items can continue to be worn for as long as they last.

For those students who opt to choose GCSE PE at KS4 there is for the start of the Autumn term the option to purchase personalised GCSE PE t-shirts and quarter zip tops. This is not compulsory, and the normal Bishop Rawstorne PE kit can still be worn.

GUIDANCE AND CLARIFICATION

Please find below some notes for guidance and clarification. By being specific about our requirements we aim to prevent misunderstandings as we do not wish for parents to spend money on items we do not allow to be worn. The full support of parents is expected with regards to their children wearing the correct uniform.

Belts

Belts should be black, with a discrete buckle.

Coats

Outdoor coats should be PLAIN navy blue or black only with no large exterior markings or logos; no fur jackets, sweatshirts, denim jackets, hooded tops, tracksuit tops or any other 'fashion' coats are allowed as outdoor coats. Understated scarves can be worn during inclement weather but, like coats, should not be worn inside the school buildings.

Blazers

Blazers must be worn at all times unless specific permission has been given by a member of staff for it to be taken off. Sleeves must not be rolled up. No other garment other than a school jumper and shirt must be worn underneath (e.g. no hoodies allowed) including en route to and from school. Shirts should be always tucked in. The jumper (navy and logoed) is the optional part of the school uniform. A blazer should always be worn to and from school.

Skirts

Skirts should be knee length and waistbands must not be rolled over. Very short skirts are not permitted. When purchasing, please allow for growth throughout the year.

Jewellery and Make Up

For health and safety reasons, no jewellery is allowed. This includes piercings of any variety, bracelets, necklace, anklets, rings etc However, a cross may be worn if tucked into a shirt. No studs, earrings or piercings should be worn in school, and this applies even if the hole for the piercing has recently been made. The covering of piercings by plasters will not be allowed. Smart watches are not allowed. They will be confiscated in line with our Online Safety and Acceptable IT Use Policy.

No make-up of any kind is permitted. No false tan, nail varnish, false eyelashes, cosmetic eyebrows, false nails, nail extensions or gel colour, body piercings, tattoos or visible body art (permanent or temporary) are permitted.

Hair

Students must ensure that hair is always of one natural colour. Hair should have no bright or extreme colourings must be no shorter than Grade 2 **overall**. Long-hair should be tied back away from the face (boys and girls) Shavings, etchings or extreme styling will not be tolerated and hair must be no shorter than a Grade 2 and blended.

Hair must not cover the face. Hair accessories should be discrete – plain hair bands/slides/bobbles plain and dark in colour. Ribbons are not acceptable. If you are unsure on the suitability of a hair style, we strongly advise you to contact school or alternatively, please refer to the images on the school website.

Contravention of the school hair policy may necessitate in break and lunchtime detentions, parents being telephoned and, in some cases, students remaining in inclusion until the hairstyle is rectified.

Facial hair is usually not permitted, e.g. no long side burns, beards or moustaches. Students should be clean shaven. This will be considered on a case by case basis, for example facial hair in relation to faith reasons.

Shoes and Socks

If you are unsure on the suitability of a shoe we strongly advise you to contact school before purchasing or alternatively you can see images of suitable footwear on the school website. Students will be asked to correct their footwear if not appropriate and we will aim to provide suitable shoes in the meantime.

Socks should be plain black OR navy. White socks are not permitted. Trainer socks, logoed socks, coloured or patterned socks, socks with frills or bows and P.E. socks are not permitted. Socks must not be worn over the knee.

BREACHES OF POLICY

The Uniform and Appearance Policy will be strictly enforced. Every opportunity will be given for students to conform to the uniform policy and rectify any identified issues.

Minor breaches of uniform or appearance regulations will result in a break and lunch time detention, at the discretion of the pastoral team, in the first instance. This sanction will be increased for persistent offenders.

A more serious breach of the school's rules on uniform or appearance could result in students being issued with an after-school detention or spending time in inclusion. In some cases, a uniform contract will be used to reinforce the expectations that the school has. The school can refuse to allow a student to come into school for failing to wear the uniform or maintain the appearance required. Persistent breach of the uniform and appearance regulations could result in a fixed term exclusion from school.

The school is always the final arbiter of what constitutes appropriate and acceptable dress and appearance.
