Dear Parent/Guardian

At the start of another school year, it has been a pleasure to welcome our new Year 7s into Bishop Rawstorne and to sense their anticipation and excitement as they start this part of their education journey. In terms of their uniform and overall appearance, conduct and attitude to the changes they face each day, I have been delighted with these girls and boys and I know the staff as a whole have spoken so highly of the start they have made. At the start of term, we had our usual Year 7 Welcome Service which took place in St Michaels and All Angels Church in Croston and was led by our Year 7 chaplain, Reverend Janet Taylor.
