YEAR 9 VISIT TO THE YORKSHIRE SCULPTURE PARK – MAY 2026

To support the Year 9 curriculum, we have organised an enrichment visit to The Yorkshire Sculpture Park, West Bretton, Wakefield, Yorkshire. This visit will take place on Friday 15 May 2026 and all Year 9 students will be expected to participate.

The Sculpture Park will offer students an insight into a variety of learning experiences including a 'Walk, Talk and Make' workshop which comprises of an artist-led session which takes students on a creative journey through the park, responding to the sculpture and the natural environment. This two-hour session is an opportunity for students to find ways of questioning and sharing ideas about art through creative making and artist-guided activities, as a way of looking at and responding to sculpture. The rest of the time in the park will be given for the students to explore.

Students should wear appropriate clothing suitable for outdoor activities including footwear ready for walking around the park. We will depart from school after morning registration and will return at about 5.00pm. The students will need to make their own way home from school at this time. If you are collecting your child, please could the area outside the primary school be kept clear to allow the buses to drop off safely.

To assist with meeting the cost of the visit, including coach transport, we are requesting a payment of £18.00 per student. Please make payment on 'iPayimpact' by following the link in the payment message or by going through the 'iPayimpact' website by Monday 27 April 2025. **When payment is made online, we assume that you have provided implied consent and have agreed to the terms set out in this letter.**

If a student has monies to the school outstanding, then he/she may not be permitted to join the trip until outstanding monies have been paid. Students will not be permitted to join the trip if we do not have a completed Form 3.

Any place offered on an educational visit is conditional and may subsequently be reviewed by the Senior Leadership Team of the Academy if a student's presence is identified as being potentially prejudicial to the health and safety of those participating in the visit.
