Firstly, I cannot believe that we have already got to the end of half term! Thank you for all your support with our launch of Times Tables Rockstars and we have enjoyed listening to children as they now discuss passionately the times tables battles around school. This has been a fantastic success and I would like to pass on thanks for Mr Dale and Miss Mullany, our Maths Leads, for the launch! We took part in our first national 'battle' last week for National Number Day and our 'Most Valuable Player' certificates were presented in assembly on Friday. Brodie was the overall most valuable player for school in the battle and we came in the top 1000 schools, which is a great achievement for our first try!

This week we will be saying farewell to the wonderful Mrs Webb, our Reception teaching assistant, who is moving to a new area. We are incredibly grateful for all her hard work over the years as part of the Early Years team and wish her the best of luck in her new home.

Mrs Bradley and Mrs Knowles will officially be taking over Mrs Webb's role after half term.

Phase 2 of relocating classrooms- Reception and Year 3 swap



As part of our improvements to the use of the school building and our transition work for pupils ready for September we will be doing phase 2 of our classroom move by Easter, so Reception will be moving over to the original purpose built classrooms where Year 3 are now and Year 3 will be moving in to the main part of school where Reception currently are so that they are closer to Year 2 and the junior classes. We are planning this move early for three reasons.

Firstly, in the summer we will be starting the planned replacement of the whole school roof, so will have limited access to the main building (this move would originally have happened last summer but we were not able to get in to the building till right at the end of the holidays). The open plan nature of the classrooms, where Year 3 are now, is not ideal when teaching two separate classes at the same time, but is perfect for Reception children who need to be able to access indoor and outdoor continuous provision, with high quality play and exploration as well participating in smaller group adult-led sessions in the same room. Even the toilets down near these rooms are still the Reception height toilets that were originally installed 15 years ago!

Secondly, although in theory, keeping the Reception class near Pre-School should have worked, the access from the classroom they are in now to the outside space is really difficult due to the layout of the doors and windows. The classroom space itself has been lovely and pupils are enjoying having a quieter space to learn and play. However, we need to make sure that continuous outdoor provision is available at all times for our youngest pupils and this way they will have access to lots of space ready for the better weather in the summer term. This will be a permanent move for the better for both year groups. Watch this space as we prepare the outside area near this classroom over the coming weeks.

Lastly, by now, we should have been preparing to start accepting the first of our 2 year old pupils, but this has been delayed till the end of the year, due to several Nursery projects across the Trust. We will be sending out expressions of interest forms towards Easter to see which families would be interested in their child being able to attend from the term after their second birthday. This is part of the reason for Reception moving from the Pre-School building this year, to give us space for our new younger pupils. We will let parents know if this is something we will be able to offer from September 2025, but it may be a Jan 26 launch at this point in time.



Helping our pupils with transition

We will also be starting transition work with staffing, so Miss Mullany and Mr Dale will each be spending two afternoons a week in Reception, working alongside Mrs Harrison/Mrs Paden, to start to work with their future children and one afternoon a week either Mrs Harrison or Mrs Paden will be popping over to work with Mrs DeJesus and the Pre-School team to support our Pre-School pupils. This keeps that magic of our teamwork approach that the school is famous for, where pupils are able to create positive relationships with a wide range of staff across the team.

In Year 1 and 2, we will be keeping the separate model for teaching Reading, Writing, Phonics, Spelling in the mornings, but now that Year 1 have completed their Reception to Year 1 project for the Trust, they will be moving back to having mixed year group teams for the afternoons. The essence of the success of our school is that pupils get to work with pupils in different year groups and work with different staff across the team and this is something we have missed over the past term and a half for our Key Stage 1 team. This also enables us to continue to provide interventions in afternoons and pupils in Year 1 and 2 will get more Music, PE and French time on Tuesday afternoons when in three groups not four, as up to now we have had to alternate Music and French every week for these children when working in separate year groups to be able to fit everything in.

If you have any spare moving boxes that you might be able to donate to help us pack up the classrooms for Year 3 and Reception we would be really grateful, please just pop them in to the office.
