Gateway's Amazing Learning! Nursery and Reception Year 3 and 4

We have had such a busy week in Early Years! In Reception the children have begun to learn the story of Little Red Riding. After learning that Grandmas lived in a cottage we looked at homes from around the world and then built are own - there are many fabulous creations and some budding architects! In maths we have been learning all about length and height - we have been comparing lengths and heights and are using accurate mathematical vocabulary.







In Nursery the children have been learning about staying safe in the sun and reading 'George the Sunsafe Superstar'. Now that the sun has finally arrived Nursery have been learning all about summer - fingers crossed the good weather continues!

Year 1 and 2 This week in Year 1, the children have really enjoyed

learning our new story called Beggu. We have been learning it off by heart by using story maps in class. It is a story about a small alien that gets lost and can not find anybody to help. This has not only helped us with our own writing this week but also taught us about being kind to others.



In year 2 this week, the children have spent the majority of the week learning in the new classrooms on the playground. The children really enjoyed it and showed how grown up and mature they can be when faced with a change in setting. We have been focusing on addition and subtraction this week and making sure we can use all the correct mathematical vocabulary when talking about our maths. This week we had a surprising gift left in year 3, upon opening we discovered a papaya, we enjoyed tasting it. The strange thing was the fact that we kept hearing a little noise, and to our amazement found out that the papaya spoke. We are continuing to explore the story, looking at how to punctuate speech. Our new science topic is light, and we learnt how the phrase moonlight is actually incorrect, as the moon is not a light source. We are also on the last chapter of our book Beaver Towers which has had the children gripped.

In 4B the children thoroughly enjoyed starting their Science for the half term, as they recreated teeth using marshmallows. In 4G, the children were being occupied with some drumming lessons in a South American Samba style, which I am sure they will continue to enjoy over the next few weeks. We have also spent our maths lessons playing a range of games to help us recall our times tables facts. The children need to be practising these as much as possible as we will be assessing them on their knowledge soon.

Year 6 have had a very exciting week as they begin to think about their leavers' activities. We have lots planned for them and are looking forward to enjoying our last few weeks with them. They have started planning their enterprise stall to raise some money, in maths they are designing their own farm to make as much profit as possible and in English they have started reading a book called Unstoppable with some workshops from BFC.

In Year 5, they have been reading a warning story called The Canal and thinking about times when they were warned about something but did it anyway! In history, they have started looking at crime and punishment and how this has changed over the centuries!
