

Dear Parents and Carers,

What a wonderful start for the beginning of the school year and my first half term as Head of School. It feels hard to believe there is only a week to go before we break up for our two week break. Thank you for your support and for helping the children get back into their routines. This is so important for children. It really does help when children arrive in school along with neat uniforms and on time. We have seen some real successes around the development of our Core Value of 'Pride' over the last few weeks, and being in school and on time helps the day get off to an effective start every day, ready to learn.

There are also some new developments to let you know about ready for our next half term.

Magic Breakfasts

I am really excited at being able to offer the Magic Breakfast to all children from Wednesday 6th November 2019 starting at 8.15am. We will receive children directly into the hall each morning and a separate letter will give you more details. This will be available to all children wherever possible and will have the offer of a healthy breakfast in class everyday. The reasons why we are going ahead with this are as follows:

- Every child will have access to breakfast which will give them a calm and healthy start to the day.
- It is free for every child without barrier or stigma
- Lateness should reduce as children will be keen not to miss their breakfast
- Children's wellbeing should benefit with that social time with their peers
- Pupil progress should benefit as we will not have any hungry children who can't focus on their learning and a calmer start means children are more ready to learn
- The children will have the opportunity to try new foods throughout the year
- Family time should improve as there is no rush to prepare your child's breakfast
- It should be fun to eat with your class and school adults

We are hoping it will be a great success and that the children enjoy this extra social time in school. More details to follow.

School Gate drop off and collection

We have been trying to address the children's well-being when coming into school. The KS2 teachers have been waiting at their class doors on the first floor of school as the KS1 teachers already do. This has been very effective and helped us spot any children who have wanted to share concerns or address any upset first thing. The children, once in class, go on to undertake a set, calm activity until it is time for the register and the school day can then start in the best way possible. We have been working on our Core Values of resilience and also helping children self-regulate and take responsibility and they have risen to the challenge!

In addition, you may have noticed the senior staff on the wider back gates and not the school door. This has helped with congestion and a calm flow into school whilst also allowing for parents to talk to a member of staff after saying goodbyes to their children. This allows children to walk into school independently so we will continue this and ask that you support us by encouraging your child to enter school from these gates by themselves to help prepare for the school day. This principle can be followed at the front gate where generally Mrs Riley is and any messages to class teachers can be given to the gate staff and will be passed on personally. I appreciate Nursery and Reception parents will want to and should see their children into the building. There is of course Class dojo to pass on any messages too. Especially useful if it is raining!



Please be very mindful of safeguarding all children when dropping off children in vehicles. We have witnessed some very uncomfortable situations and a little bit of a walk versus a child having an accident is always preferable. We don't want to have a serious accident to deal with. Please drive and park responsibly at all times.

Parents' Evening

This will be held on **Wednesday 6th November** and more details to follow. Just to let you know it will take a different format this year and each meeting with the teacher will be in your child's classroom. There will be seating outside classrooms and books to look through whilst you wait as usual.

Meanwhile in the hall we hope to hold a 'Marketplace' where you can get refreshments and also have a chat with the school nurse, Senco, Family Engagement officer and local police. We will hold a prize draw for attendance at the 'Marketplace' and you will receive a raffle ticket upon entry but it will hopefully also help parents meet staff and community representatives and offer social connections too.

There will be a chance to complete a Parent Survey on the night too. Please let us know what you think so we can drive forward the standards and take your views into account
