This has allowed staff to develop their understanding and gain new ideas for lessons to be more successful with the children engaged.</p> <p>There have been sport bags provided to each year group for them to use during break and lunch times. A structured play has allowed the children to continue developing their physical and team work skills which has reduced behaviour issues during these times and improved their readiness to learn when re-entering the classroom.</p>

Allows storage of videos and photographs for evidence. No kit tracking 	£699	<p>This app has been a central place for all staff to record their evidence with either photos or videos. It provides planning with examples of videos and key questions that teachers could ask their pupils.</p> <p>The app is broken down into each lesson with different ideas, allowing for differentiation to challenge all pupils using STEP.</p> <p>We have used this all year and it has provided the subject lead with evidence and necessary data which allows us to assess the children and know what their next steps are, leading to accelerated progress in PE.</p>

It has supported a range of ideas to continue to develop the children's fundamental skills which is important for skills they will learn during their school journey. As a result of this 11 out of 17 children (65%) were on track in their physical skills going into Reception.</p> <p>Blackpool Football Club have been working alongside staff and our curriculum developing their confidence and offering support and ideas to teach PE. This has been beneficial for children to be engaged during their sessions and develop their physical, communication and teamwork skills.</p>

We ordered bean bags, a cricket set, different types of balls (basket, tennis, football, netballs), chalk, hurdles, hoops, cones, battens and replaced new gymnastics mats. This allowed children to successfully complete lessons using the correct resources.

Each child has been provided with a skipping rope which is accessible to them during breaks and in lessons if needed.
