


nazinge Jaleway's A, ursery and Receptio earning 1 and 2

This week in Reception we have been enjoying learning all about capacity - we have had lots of fun investigating which containers hold the most and least amounts. We have been using lots of new language such as full, half full and empty. The children have had lots of fun exploring this in our outside area too! In PE we have been learning to develop our invasion games skills such as throwing and catching and even moving into a space - I definitely think we have some future Olympic stars in our midst! In Nursery the children have been practicing their positional language - look out for the children talking about on top, behind and next too. Also a gentle reminder about Nursery Graduation photos on 21st June - what a wonderful reminder that will be of their Nursery time I can not wait to see them all dressed up!



This week in Year 1, we have continued to learn about plants and thee the different parts that make a plant. We have also selected some fantastic work that we have put up on our working wall. In Year 2, we have been learning obout Islam and how Muslims feel a sense of belonging through prayer and visiting the Mosque. We then looked at our own lives and picked out the different things in our life that help us feel like we belong.





This week in Year 3 we have been learning about dragons. We got a very exciting letter from a dragon magazine asking us to write about a Thunder Dragon! We thought about where a Thunder Dragon might live and what it might look like. We can't wait to send it off! In Science we found out how soil is formed and tested BGA soil, clay, sandy, and chalky loam soil. We added water and are watching them over the next few days. In DT we had great fun painting our volcanoes, they are nearly finished! This week in Year 4 has been a week of isolation and home learning! It has been great to see so many pupils online as we did some writing together based on a machine we designed - 'the parent-pleaser'! We've also had good fun in between our learning with some fun online games: scavenger hunts, word games, music quizzes, hangman. In reading, we have spent the week looking at different poems and found some excellent new vocabulary! All that being said, we are looking forward to Monday! Have a lovely weekend!

The children in Y6 have had a very busy week! They have shown great maturity with their assessments where they have had a go at the 2019 SATs paper. In art, they have been designing their own wire sculptures using trees as their inspiration - they are looking amazing!
