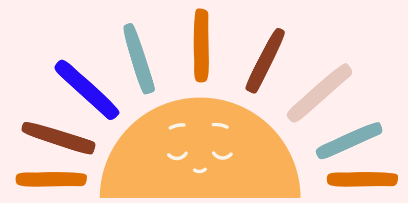

We will be selling poppies over the next couple of weeks to raise money for the Poppy Appeal to remember the fallen soldiers and those who fight for us today.

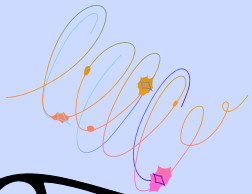
