# Gateway's Amazing Learning! Nursery and Reception Year 1 and 2

The children in EYFS have returned fantastically well. They have remembered our routines and have got straight back to learning. We have begun our half term looking for signs of winter in our environment and we were very excited by the very brief flurry of snow we had! In Talk for Writing we have been learning 'Stickman' and story maps and text have gone home via Dojo. In maths we continue to investigate length and using key words such as long, longer and longest, and short, shorter and shortest.

### Year 3 and 4

In Year 3 this week we have been learning about plants in Science. We identified parts of the plant and discussed the requirements for plants to live and grow. We started our investigation and made a prediction. In English, we have been busy learning our new text 'How to Trap a Wolf.' We have made up our own version looking at 'How to Trap a Bear.'

In Year 4 this week we have been investigating the states of matter in Science. In art we have been creatively adding 3D materials to pictures of teachers as part of our 3D art topic. In English we have been analysing the structure of our text 'The Magician's Shop' to support our writing.

Reminder to Year 4 parents that a Dojo message was sent about the Multiplication check in June. What a fantastic first full week in Year 1 and 2. We have been busy with our RWI reading and maths. In Year 1 art, we spoke about mixing colours and the reasons why we liked or disliked the painting we looked at. History in Year 2 this week, we have started learning about Christopher Columbus. # Year 5 and 6

Our first full week of the year has been an exciting one packed full of new topics and new learning, including electricity, the structure of the Earth and the UK. Year 5 have also resumed swimming and are making good progress, whilst the Year 6 pupils have done a 'mock SATs' paper. We've had reading and rugby sessions taking place for some children, lots and lots of story time
