How can I help my child's learning at home?

There are lots of things that you can do as a parent to assist your child with their learning:

- Try to hear your child read every night for at least 5-10 minutes – discuss what they have read, and the meaning of new words.
- Enjoy counting real life objects and setting challenges for your child, such as, can you give everyone a plate? How many did you need?
- Read a bedtime story together. Remember you can choose a book from our 'Bedtime Library'
