#### **Autumn Term 2020**

#### Writing>>>

This term we will be using our Talk for Writing skills to write about two different stories:

Our main focus will be getting the children to write sentences using capital letters and full stops correctly. They will be encouraged to use their sounds to write words as well starting to spell tricky words.

We will also be developing the use of adjectives within our writing.

#### Maths >>>

This term we will be focusing on addition and subtraction within 20 and beginning to place value to 50.

We will focus heavily on using a range of different concrete resources to support our learning. These will be:

- base 10
- number lines
- bead strings
- tens and ones counters
- 100 squares

#### **Humanities and Science**

*History:* Our topic is: Toys from the past

Our key learning question will be: Why is the Playstation more fun than

grandma and grandad's toys?

**Science:** Our topic is Everyday Materials

#### The children will learn to:

- distinguish between an object and the material from which it is made
- identify and name a variety of everyday materials, including wood, plastic, glass, metal, water, and rock
- describe the simple physical properties of a variety of everyday materials
- compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of their simple physical properties.
