Welcome to the new term! Thankfully the days are now definitely lighter and the sun is starting to appear more.

What we are learning

Year 7	The students will continue to learn the different HTML tags so that they will be able to create a simple webpage about their music festival. The students will be combining different tags, as well as, using hexadecimal colour codes. https://www.w3schools.com/html/ has some additional information about some of the HTML tags we will be learning about.
Year 8	We will be continuing our learning about animation and using Blender to create an original concept. The learners will be exploring how tweening is used to create a digital animation as well as considering the impact of SOAP on an animation. Following this the students will be moving onto designing and creating their own app.
Year 9	We will be continuing to enhance our spreadsheet skills before designing and creating a self-marking quiz in Microsoft Excel. Students will be using a range of complex formulas as well as using the programming language Visual Basic, to create some automatic elements of the quiz.
Year 10 Business	Our students will be continuing with their marketing pitch for the burger that they designed. Following this, we are going to turn our attention to the characteristics an entrepreneur has, along with the different types of business ownerships.
Year 10 Dig Tech	Students are going to start using a new piece of Augmented Reality software called BlippAR (https://www.blippar.com/). We will be skill-building over the next few weeks before starting the second piece of Controlled Assessment once the students are confident in using the software.
Year 11 Business	With the Business exam on the 20 th May, we will be focusing solely on revision of all the topics that will be assessed in it.
Year 11 Dig Tech	With the Digital Technology exam on the 15 th May, we will be focusing solely on revision of all the topics that will be assessed in it.

Revision Tip – Chunking and summarising

Chunking and summarising is an effective revision technique that can help teenagers feel more in control of their learning. This strategy encourages students to break large topics into smaller, manageable sections, which makes revision less overwhelming and easier to approach.

After studying each section, they create brief summaries using bullet points or diagrams to capture the most important ideas. By focusing on the key concepts first and then adding more detail over time, students develop a clearer and more organised understanding of the subject.

Parents can support this by encouraging their child to work in small sections and regularly review their summaries to reinforce learning.
