GUIDE TO HIGHER AND DEGREE **APPRENTICESHIPS**

Now there is a real alternative to traditional university study. With the growth of higher and degree apprenticeships, you can gain your qualification, learn professional skills, progress your career plus earn a wage, want to find out more?

With a degree apprenticeship you can achieve a full Bachelor's or Master's degree. And just like traditional degrees, an apprenticeship is a great route to a great career.

THE FACTS

If you are over 16, live in England and are not in fulltime education you can apply for an apprenticeship. Apprenticeships are available at intermediate, advanced, higher and degree levels.

All apprenticeships are real jobs so all apprentices earn a salary. You must be paid at least the national minimum apprenticeship wage and many employers pay significantly more. Apprentices should work for at least 30 hours per week, see gov.uk/national-minimum-wage-rates for further information. Entry requirements depend on the sector and prior skills. If you have achieved A-Levels you may still be expected to start at intermediate or advanced level as some sectors, such as engineering, require you to build up your occupational skills.

HOW ARE THEY STRUCTURED?

Higher and degree apprenticeships are available at levels 4-7. They combine work with study and may include a workbased, academic or combined qualification or a professional qualification relevant to the industry. Levels 4 and 5 are equivalent to a higher Education Certificate/Diploma or a foundation degree, level 6 is equivalent to a Bachelor's degree and level 7 is equivalent to a Master's degree. Typically, higher apprentices study part-time at college, university or with a training provider. Apprenticeships take between one and five years to complete.

HOW DO I FIND A HIGHER OR DEGREE APPRENTICESHIP?

Over 240,000 workplaces employed an apprentice including BAE Systems, Balfour Beatty, Cap Gemini, Ford, ITV, Airbus, Rolls Royce, Silentnight, Barclays and the BBC. (Need more local employer names). With so many opportunities on offer you can find the apprenticeship that's right for you.

Applying is easy, just visit **GOV.UK/apply-apprenticeship**. There are up to 28,000 apprenticeship vacancies on the site at any one time.

The (ASK) Apprenticeship Support and Knowledge for Schools project has been commissioned by the National Apprenticeship Service, part of the Skills Funding Agency (SFA), to support the Government's target of achieving 3 million apprenticeship starts by 2020.

Through the Project, delivery partners offer a range of inspirational and engaging apprenticeship and traineeship support to all learning establishments offering provision to years 10, 11, 12 and 13 across the North, Midlands, London and South regions.

The project aim is to work with teachers, careers advisers, parents and governors, alongside otherkey partners, to support schools and ensure that they meet their statutory duties regarding the provision of impartial IAG, specifically in relation to apprenticeships and traineeships.

The Lancashire Work Based Learning Executive Forum is the ASK delivery partner for Lancashire, coordinating the delivery of group assemblies/information sessions, registration and application workshops and careers and parents' events in schools.

The Forum also coordinates the Lancashire Apprentice Ambassador Network with in excess of 80 members. The apprenticeship ambassador members are all current or former apprentices who want to highlight the benefits of apprenticeships to employers and to other young people. They will speak about their experiences at schools, youth clubs and careers fairs and meet employers face to face to encourage them to take on apprentices.


