Head of Year Messages

A huge thank you to all who attended the progress/ options evening before half term, the turnout was great and it was lovely to speak to students regarding subject progress and what the options process will look like. We completed a first attempt (draft) on Thursday 29th February and it was great to see how prepared students were in being able to choose these. The second round of option choices will be in a few weeks' time. Mr Buchanan is currently looking at the option blocks and subjects' students wish to study.

There have been a large number of achievement points given out to students in year 9 in the last month – 9979 to be exact.

We also had 23 students with 100% attendance throughout February. The resilience of these students to get in each day, even when they are not quite feeling 100% also does not go unnoticed.

This month, our head of year messages again surround **attendance**. We started the beginning of this half term as a year group on **84.5%** attendance. However, the attendance since then has drastically improved and now sits at **85.6%**. Although still sits short of the desired 97%, it is a fantastic increase and this needs to continue. Absence from school leaves students vulnerable to falling behind, therefore we want to do all we can to support getting your child into school to make progress in their lessons.
