Aspire's Ben leads England class acts

Blackpool schoolteacher Ben Lavelle is leading some of England's top teenage footballers on a journey from Villareal to Fleetwood Town in the next few weeks.

The director of Expressive Arts at Aspire Academy is assistant manager of the England Schools Under-18 squad preparing for the home internationals.

Lavelle is spending the half-term week in Spain with the squad as they train for the Centenary Shield tournament, which entails matches against Northern Ireland, Wales, Scotland and the Republic of Ireland. The Scotland game is scheduled for Fleetwood's Highbury home on April 1.

It's another step in the part-time coaching career of the busy Lavelle, who takes over the England manager's job next season for two years. It continues his com-



mitted 15-year climb up the coaching ladder.

Ben told The Gazette: "I started coaching in Manchester and was asked to join the England set-up 15 years ago. I now have my A licence."

This week's training camp in Alicante has to be undertaken during the school half-term as Lavelle and his squad juggle the demands of international football and full-time education.

He explained: They are fantastic lads to coach because they are bright and also have a fantastic attitude. They are the best players

in full-time education and some of them do go on to earn professional contracts."

Top players to have come the England Schools system include Michael Owen and more recently Chris Smalling, while Adam Curry captained the schoolboys last season before signing for Hull City.

The selection process for the forthcoming Centenary Shield campaign began in August, with a series of school representative matches.

The international series begins against Northern Ire-

land on March 4, followed by Wales on March 8, Scotland on April 1 at Highbury and the Republic of Ireland in Shrewsbury on April 8.
