Autumn Term 2

We would like to welcome everyone back after a fantastic first half-term in Reception. We hope that you have had enjoyed your half term break. The children really enjoyed learning all about themselves, their family and people from other cultures last half term. Please ensure that your child bring in their book bag with their books and a coat into school every day.



Topic

Let's celebrate!

This half term we will be learning about what people celebrate around the world and how they celebrate special occasions. The children will learn about their own celebrations as well as the celebrations of other cultures.

Also, we will be getting ready for Christmas and our Nativity performance that will be at the end of the half term.

English

This half term we will be looking at a variety of books linked to our whole class topic. These books will include *We're going on a bear hunt* and *The snail and the whale*.

We will explore different books and discuss key events in stories. The children will learn about the different features of a book, such as the title, author and illustrator. We will also discuss different characters thoughts and feelings at specific events in stories. We encourage children to share their thoughts on books so that we can better understand the types of books that they enjoy engaging with.

Phonics

In phonics this half term we will continue to explore the 7 aspects of phase 1 phonics. These aspects are:

- Environmental
- Instrumental
- Body sounds
- Rhythm and rhyme
- Alliteration
- Voice sounds
- Oral blending and segmenting

Phase 1 phonics is focussed around encouraging your child to listen carefully and understand what they have listened to.

We will also be looking at different letters and sounds. We will be using this to complete our phonics work books and helping us to read and write words.

Mathematics

In mathematics this half term we will be exploring the numbers 1-5. We will be finding, representing and subitising the numbers 1-5.

We will also be exploring shapes with 4 sides. The children will compare squares and rectangles and look at finding different shapes in the environment.

Number blocks is a useful tool to assist your child in their understanding of numbers. These resources can be found on BBC iPlayer.

Now the weather is getting colder please ensure your child has a warm waterproof coat, hat and gloves in school every day.

Please label everything with your child's name.



We also have a large number of children who haven't brought in a pair of wellington boots.

Please send some in as soon as possible so your child can experience outdoors in all weathers.

As we get lots of wet socks in the winter months please ensure your child has spare socks in their book bags.
