

Children will be able to...

- ⇒ Talk about how we are similar and different.
- ⇒ Talk about their family and recognise how families are different.
- ⇒ Draw a self portrait

- ⇒ Name their body parts and talk about what they can achieve with their bodies.


Vocabulary	Definitions

skeleton	the bones that support our body.




