Dear Parents and Carers,

Reading: Children will take home a reading book (which will be changed weekly once they are able to read the questions based on the text) and an Accelerated Reader Book (these can be changed regularly after completing online quizzes in class). Please note that these books will only be sent home with the children who are reading regularly at home and bringing their book to school. Pupils should be reading at home daily to help increase their pace and fluency. Please ensure you sign and date your child's reading record to show they have read at home/finished a book.

More children have been reading at home and bringing their books to school each day. Thank you for your continued support with this. Children who are reading regularly are making it on to our Star Readers display and are receiving prizes. Well done to those children!

Homework: **Homework:** Spelling homework should be completed on Spelling Shed. The children should log in Monday until Thursday night to complete activities (x3 attempts to be completed). They also receive handwriting practise which has the same spelling words. They should also complete the short comprehension sheet. Times Tables Rock Stars will be the weekly maths homework and children should complete 15 minutes practice.

Please make sure you provide your child with the correct uniform for PE. Black shorts, pumps and a white t-shirt. A jumper and tracksuits may be needed for outdoor PE. Children are not allowed to wear any jewelry in PE so please make sure your child removes any jewelry on the mornings of PE days unless they can remove them themselves.
