


Factory	A building where goods are assembled.	<h3>Sticky Knowledge about Middleton</h3> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❑ Middleton is a town in South Lancashire, now Greater Manchester.</li> <li>❑ In 1974, Middleton became part of the Metropolitan Borough of Rochdale.</li> <li>❑ St. Leonard's Church is listed Outstanding Grade I by Historic England and was built in the 1600s.</li> <li>❑ Ye Olde Boar's Head P.H. began life in the 1600s and was later combined to form an Inn serving travelers and later changed into a pub.</li> </ul>	
Factory worker	A person who works in a factory.	<h3>Important</h3> <p>The town's local newspaper, the <i>Middleton Guardian</i> has a history going back to <a href="#">Victorian times</a>.<sup>[8]</sup> copies can be found in the local library of every publication since 1908.</p>	
Edgar Wood	Edgar Wood was a British architect and artist from Greater Manchester.	<p>The town was linked to the national rail network until 1964 when <a href="#">Middleton railway station</a> closed. <a href="#">Mills Hill</a> is now the nearest station</p>	
Frederick W Jackson	Frederick Jackson was born in 1859 in Middleton and is a well known artist.
