Devoting time to support pupils with their social development and relationships means that almost all pupils make significant progress in their ability to cope in social situations and as a result feel less isolated and develop a strong sense of belonging. This work allows pupils to develop positive relationships and begin to engage with a trusted adult, their class and the centre as a whole before moving back to be educated within their own communities. This reconnects often alienated, excluded pupils and their families with education and the wider goals of society with the aim of developing thoughtful, caring and active citizens.
