Complete this for ANY medication that your child needs, and to allow us to administer painkillers or antihistamines.

Behaviour bond

Parent and child sign to indicate their commitment to keeping our behaviour promise before and during PGL.

Non-negotiables

All children MUST bring, and use:

- A sun hat
- High-factor sun protection cream
- A refillable water bottle

Adults will remind you BUT you are responsible for having these items with you for ALL activities.

Behaviour expectations

Our Boughton B's apply before and during the trip:

Be Kind

Be Safe

Be Responsible

Our ultimate responsibility is to keep everyone safe.

We expect everyone to behave in a way that will make this possible.

Safe choices include:

- listening to and following adult instructions in lessons and outside
- doing what you are supposed to do, when you are supposed to do it
- not backchatting adults, arguing or being rude
- respecting others around you, so that they can listen and learn too
- using our character strengths to help you: self-control, compassion, respect, co-operation, teamwork, kindness...

What do we mean by unsafe behaviour?

Any inappropriate behaviour, whether physical or not, that compromises the safety of the individual or others in their group.

Physical unsafe behaviour includes:

- Pushing
- Punching
- Kicking, stamping on or jumping on others
- Pulling clothes/hair
- Lifting, carrying, piggy-backs, shoulder rides etc
- Biting, spitting
- Strangling, head-locking

Unsafe, non-physical, includes:

- Non-compliance (not listening to or following instructions)
- Defiance (refusal to follow instructions, after prompting)
- Arguing or back-chatting adults

Why do we need to BE SAFE?

5 or more different adults each day at PGL (so need to prove we can be safe for adults at school!)

Several sets of instructions

Several activities take place at height or on water, where safety is absolutely paramount.

Group leaders from PGL & school adults will be telling you what you are doing, where you need to be and what you need to bring.

You will need to listen to the activity coaches so that you AND EVERYONE ELSE is safe during every activity

Process for unsafe behaviour BEFORE PGL.

We have 4 school weeks until we go.

Normal behaviour policy and processes: W,1,2,3 and reflection.

Reflection as a witness, which doesn't lead to a consequence = not an issue.



Stages 1-4: Before PGL

Behaviour	Triggers stage:	Consequence
Repeated, unsafe choices at school	1	Pupil is put on report. Every part of the day is monitored and awarded a green, orange or pink highlight. Oranges and pinks will be closely monitored.
Behaviour continues: receiving more than two pinks (equivalent to two 3's) on the report in a week	2	Meeting with parents and pupil: first warning Support plan in place to assist pupil in making appropriate choices in class and outside, including attitude towards ALL adults.
Behaviour continues: as above	3	Meeting with parents and pupil: final warning Final opportunity for pupil to prove they can make safe choices at school
Behaviour continues: as above	4	Decision by school as to whether the pupil can attend PGL, based on being able to make consistent SAFE choices.

Stages 1-4: Before PGL

Behaviour	Triggers stage:	Consequence
Repeated, unsafe choices at school		Pupil is suspended for one day and awarded a green,
Behaviour continues: receiving more than 1 pink (3's) on the report card per week		Meeting with parents and pupil: final warning Final opportunity for pupil to prove they can make safe choices at school
Behaviour continues: as above	4	Decision by school as to whether the pupil can attend PGL, based on being able to make consistent SAFE choices.

A suspension for unsafe behaviour at any point in this process will **AUTOMATICALLY** mean that the pupil will not attend PGL.

Stages 5 & 6: During PGL

Behaviour	Triggers stage:	Consequence
Pupil makes unsafe choices at PGL but wasn't already on report at school	4a	Pupil is put on report. Every part of the day is monitored and awarded a green, orange or pink highlight. More than 2 pinks in a day: first warning Sanctions issued at PGL e.g. missing out on an activity as a consequence.
Pupil was already on report at school (any stage) OR has gone onto a report at PGL	5	Pupil continues on report. Every part of the day is monitored and awarded a green, orange or pink highlight. More than 2 pinks in a day: final warning Further sanctions issued and a pre-emptive phone call to parents to advise this.
Further unsafe choices	6	Phone call to collect: pupil suspended for the remainder of the week.

Stages 5 & 6: During PGL

Behaviour	Triggers	Consequences
Pupil makes unsafe choices at PGL but wasn't already on a report at school	4	orange or pink
Pupil was on a report at school (any stage) onto a report at PGL		sequence. colored and awarded a green, orange or
Further unsafe choices		Phone call to collect: pupil suspended for the remainder of the week.

We reserve the right to go straight to stage 6, if the unsafe behaviour requires this.

Other reminders

Devices

No phones.

Switches, tablets etc allowed for the journey there and back.

Mrs Cullum locks them away to keep them safe whilst we are busy at PGL!

We charge them the night before we leave.

Snacks and treats

Allowed for the week!

But don't spoil your meals!

Photos

We will post a whole group picture daily, only featuring pupils for whom we have consent.

Children are not allowed to take photos on their devices.

Contact with home

We have a school mobile number that we will share with parents.

Parents can call us if needed, for OUT OF SCHOOL HOURS, emergency contact.

We will ONLY call a parent if:

- For pre-arranged purposes (e.g. birthday)
- There is a medical emergency
- A child reaches stage 5 of the behaviour process (pre-emptive call)
- A child reaches stage 6 of the behaviour process (collection and suspension)
- In the event of any other emergency
