Before Easter Year 2 took part in their long awaited Victorian day.

The day started with learning about how Victorian children would start their day with Morning Drill, reciting the National Anthem and the rules of the classroom. We sat in separate rows of boys and girls, just like they would have in Victorian times, and were called up to answer questions of arithmetic, writing and reading a tongue twister. Some of us were even made to wear a dunce's hat. Next we learned about some famous Victorians like Charles Dickens, Ada Lovelace, Mary Shelley and John Cadbury.

After break, we found out about the jobs children of around our age might have had such as; working in factories, down mines, scaring birds and painting the tips of matchsticks. We acted these out in groups and learned how dangerous some jobs could be for just a few shillings.

After that we played some Victorian games like 'The Minster's Cat', marbles and wink murder as well as making our own Victorian toy - a Thaumatrope!

Towards the end of the day we looked at some Victorian artefacts and made guesses as to what they could be - we saw a Victorian hot water bottle, an iron and a pie topper.

## Year 4

English – All the children were very excited when, on Wednesday morning, they discovered that there had been some kind of frog invasion during Tuesday night. They discovered that this linked to the wordless picture book, Tuesday by David Wiesner, which we are using as a stimulus for writing news articles. So far, the children have been learning about the features of news articles, including headlines and direct and reported speech.

Spelling – Mrs Chappenden's and Mrs Steadman's group are looking at words with Latin roots and use the 'sc' spelling with a 's' sound. Mr Bradbury's group are looking at words ending with the 'l' sound focusing on those using


Maths – In maths, all groups have continued their work on decimals, including dividing one and two-digit numbers by 10 and 100 where the answer is a decimal and ordering decimals.

the 'le', 'el' or 'al' spelling.

In other subjects, we have started to study how the vast array of living things in the world are grouped in Science. We have started learning about why the Anglo-Saxons came to Britain and where they settled in history. In art, we have looked at the work of Pablo Picasso and started to create artwork with mixed media.

At the end of last term, the children built Roman catapults and enjoyed competing in groups to see whose could fire a ping pong ball the furthest.
