LORIC Rewards

Earlier this year, we launched the LORIC system, which focuses on rewarding students for demonstrating **Leadership, Organisation, Resilience, Initiative, and Communication** in their daily school life.

Students collect LORIC points (stamps) in their planners for demonstrating any of these qualities in lessons. Students who collect 20 or more LORIC points are entered into a **weekly prize draw** from their Head of Year. Throughout the year, we also celebrate achievements for the form group with the highest number of LORIC points. These include termly form breakfasts, prizes and events for each year group.

In KS3, students have been working on the **LORIC Bronze Pledge** in form time. This is a series of challenges designed to help students develop and demonstrate their LORIC skills.

This pledge encourages students to actively engage in tasks that promote personal growth and contribute to their success at school.

Students who complete the bronze pledge will be rewarded with a trip as a celebration of their hard work and commitment. The full list of challenges and how to get involved can be viewed on the school website. We encourage all KS3 students to take on the challenge and strive to complete the LORIC Bronze Pledge before the end of the year.

In KS4, our **'Be Seen Revising'** initiative for KS4 students' rewards students to engage in effective study habits and we have a number of rewards linked to GCSE Pod, LORIC qualities, engagement and attendance. There are prizes such as **leavers hoodies, vouchers and free prom tickets** linked to these initiatives.



Student Leadership

We have also launched a number of student leadership opportunities, giving our students the chance to take on important roles within the school community.

The school council has been introduced this week, providing a platform for students to voice their opinions, contribute to decision-making, and play an active role in shaping the school environment.

Leadership opportunities such as LORIC leaders, Subject leaders, Transition leaders and Eco leaders opportunities will help students further develop their LORIC skills, particularly in the areas of Leadership and Communication. We encourage all students to get involved and make a positive impact on our school.

Summer Trips and Visits:

As we look ahead to the remainder of the year, we have an exciting range of activities and events planned to continue rewarding and celebrating our students' achievements. During **Enrichment week**, students will have the opportunity to engage in a variety of activities designed to build on their LORIC skills and foster personal growth.

We are also excited to announce that all year groups will have the chance to take part in end-of-year trips, providing memorable experiences and further opportunities for learning outside the classroom.

The Heads of Year have taken student voice on these and are busy planning trips for their year groups to various places, including **a day at the seaside, Xscape and Alton Towers**.

Our Year 9 students will have the chance to celebrate their progress with a special **'KS3 Graduation disco'**, and Year 11 students can look forward to their well-deserved **prom** in July. Over the Easter period, we will be offering a range of fun and engaging activities such as **quizzes and challenges** linked to LORIC, encouraging students to continue developing their skills. We are proud to support our students' journeys and look forward to these exciting events throughout the year.





Enrichment Activities:

We offer a wide range of activities after school – our **extra-curricular** information can be found on the school website. These include various sports clubs, fixtures and competitions, drama clubs, science, music ensembles.
