Homework

<u>Math's homework</u>

Children will receive Maths homework each week on a Monday. The homework will be a paper sheet which will consolidate the children's learning. Dojo points will be added for those children who complete this homework on time. Sumdog is a great way to practice your maths skills and you can earn extra dojos.

Reading

Children need to read regularly to develop fluency. In school we will aim to read as much as possible with children but *reading at home* is very important too. Logging children's reading on BoomReader helps us track this and we will award dojo points.
