DEMOCRACY	 To know and understand the term 'democracy' and why it matters to have your say To know how 'democracy' has changed over time [including the importance of the Suffragette movement] To know the roles of the prime minister and members of parliament, and to know the names of the main political parties in the UK To understand the democratic process that are in place at Bradley Green, and to experience taking part in a fair vote To know our rights and responsibilities as a citizen of Britain To understand that making a choice or a decision has consequences, both positive and negative To be able to express their own viewpoints, and to be able to listen to, value and respect the viewpoints of others To be able to take part in a debate, representing their feelings and beliefs powerfully through argument, persuasion, fact and opinion [including through Smart School Council sessions and Picture News assemblies] To know what the Rule of Law is and be able to explain what it is, and why we have it in place To be able to explain how the law impacts their day-to-day lives To know how laws are made in Britain, and identify who is responsible for making and changing laws in the UK
THE RULE OF LAW	 To know the difference between rules and laws To know different rules, in the school and beyond, learning their value and purpose To know that different places have different rules and understand why this is To be able to identify if there has been an injustice and, and to be able to argue their point appropriately To know and understand the role of the Police in a democratic society
INDIVIDUAL LIBERTY	 To be able to define the terms 'Individual Liberty' and 'freedom', and to be able to explain the right to live in freedom and individual liberty To know and understand ways to support other people's right to live in freedom and individual liberty To know that individual liberty needs to be within the rules. To experience exploring their own individual liberty to become the person they want to be (within the rules)
MUTUAL RESPECT AND TOLERANCE OF THOSE WITH DIFFERENT FAITHS AND BELIEFS	 To know what 'tolerance' and 'mutual respect' means and know why they are important To understand how all people are equal and yet also different To be able to discuss in depth the differences between people, such as differences of faith, ethnicity, disability, gender or sexuality and differences of family situations To know what 'The Equality Act 2010' is, and know what the protected characteristics in the act are [age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage or civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, sexual orientation] To be able to challenge prejudicial or discriminatory behaviour To know how to be welcoming towards people and to practice being welcoming
