870AD - The Viking explore Iceland and settle there 886AD AD - Britain is split into two. The Vikings in the North and East (Danelaw) and the Saxons in the South and West (Wessex).

924 AD - Athelstan defeats the Vikings at The Battle of Brunanburh (Bromborough) and rules over the whole Kingdom of England as a Saxon King.

1013-1042 - Danish / Viking Kings rule England 1042 - 1066 - Edward the Confessor (a Saxon) rules England from Winchester


1066 AD - The Vikings are defeated by Harold Godwinson - who is later defeated by William the Conqueror. The Norman Age begin.
