Key Information

- 1 When vegetables are cooked, they change. Can you talk about the changes before and after you eat.
- 2 Scarecrows are used by farmers to scare away the birds, so they don't eat the seeds.
- 3 In autumn lots of fruit and vegetables have grown because they have had the right amount of sun and rain to help them. They are usually ready for harvesting in the autumn.
- 4 Leaves that change colour in the autumn grow on deciduous trees.
- 5 Leaves that don't change colour in the autumn grow on evergreen trees.
- 6 Human's can't eat all the fruit that comes from trees, but other animals often do.
- 7 Sometimes we can eat different parts of a plant– the root (carrot or turnip) the stem (celery, asparagus) , the seeds (peas, beans), or the fruit (orange, plum).

Vocabulary

<b>Seasons</b>	There are four seasons each year, spring, summer, autumn and winter.
<b>Autumn</b>	In autumn the weather gets colder, the leaves start to fall off the trees. The amount of daylight becomes less. This means the daytimes are shorter and the night times are longer.
<b>Weather</b>	The weather includes the temperature outside, the wind direction and strength as well as rain, cloud, snow, sun and hail.
<b>Harvest</b>	The process of gathering crops.
<b>Vegetables</b>	A plant, or part of a plant used as food.
<b>Fruit</b>	A sweet and fleshy product of a tree or plant that contains a seed and can be eaten as food.
<b>Dig</b>	Break up and move earth with a tool.
<b>Plant</b>	A plant is a living thing. When it has the right conditions, it will grow.
<b>Seed</b>	Part of the plant that can grow into another plant.
<b>Acorn</b>	An acorn is the fruit of an oak tree.
<b>Conker</b>	The fruit of a horse chestnut tree. A hard shiny brown nut. These would give humans tummy ache if we ate them, but other animals love them.
<b>Turnip</b>	A root vegetable. We can eat the root of this plant.
