Key Information

1	A journey could be for a holiday or a day trip.
2	You can go on a journey by car, boat, bus, coach, aeroplane, ferry, train or on foot.
3	People going on journeys often use maps to plan their route. There are many different types of map.
4	A Sat-Nav is a bit like a map, but it is able to use satellites in space to locate where you are and where you need to go.
5	Explorers sometimes need to use a compass to help them, it shows where north, south, east and west are.
6	In our story 'Going on a Bear Hunt'. The explorers go on a journey to hunt for a bear. A bear is a large, heavy mammal that walks on the soles of its feet, has thick fur and a very short tail.
7	Most bears are omnivores. This means they eat both plants and animals.
8	People need to think of suitable clothing, footwear and food before they go on a journey.

<b>Journey</b>	An act of travelling from one place to another.
<b>Map</b>	A diagram of an area of land or sea.
<b>Expedition</b>	A journey undertaken by a group of people for a particular purpose.
<b>Explorer</b>	A person who explores a new or unfamiliar area.
<b>Discover</b>	To find unexpectedly or during a search.
<b>Grasslands</b>	A large open area of country covered with grass.
<b>River</b>	A large natural stream of water flowing in a channel to the sea, a lake or a river.
<b>Swamp</b>	An area of uncultivated ground where water collects.
<b>Forest</b>	A large area covered with trees and undergrowth.
<b>Snowstorm</b>	A heavy fall of snow, especially with a high wind.
<b>Cave</b>	A natural underground in a hillside or cliff.
