Muslims are not allowed to eat or drink during daylight hours in the month of Ramadan.

Yom Kippur is a day to reflect and on the past year and ask God's forgiveness for any sins. Jews do not work or go to school on this day. They donate money to charities

Jewish people eat apples and honey at Rosh Hashanah to represent a sweet new year.

Food often reminds us of the reasons we are celebrating.
