



Bradley Green Primary Academy PE Premium

During the school year of 2024-2025, Bradley Green Primary Academy has received £17,740 to improve the quality of sport and PE provision at Bradley Green Primary Academy. Our vision has been to continue to create a culture that encourages all children to be active and have positive attitudes towards physical activity and healthy lifestyles. We want all pupils leaving primary school to be physically literate and leave with the knowledge, skills, and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport. We also want to give children experiences that are broad and develop them as people through visits, competitions, festivals and visitors to school.

The funding has been allocated to:

- to achieve School Games Platinum Award the first time that our school has been awarded with this status.
- attend a range of tournaments targeting a range of children and ability types, such as tag rugby, dodgeball, swimming, girls' only football festivals, mixed football matches, handball, cricket and hockey.
- participated in events such as the Bunny Hop Challenge, Run for Uganda and Sports Day to engage parents in our PE lessons and physical activities.
- signed up and paid for Tameside SSP to allow access to competitions, festivals and high quality CPD in sports such as dance.
- provide extra-curricular clubs for those wanting to progress skills after school with dedicated sport coaches. We have targeted specific groups, such as girls and KS1 to encourage a wider take-up of afterschool sporting opportunities for children
- provide transport for children to attend 10-pin bowling and RobinWood activity centre to increase children opportunities and experiences of a wider range of physical activities.
- create a more active schools to ensure children get their 60 active minutes per day. We have used funding to buy and replenish our 'scrap shed' which encourages activity play at lunchtime, new playground equipment for breaktime.
- give leadership opportunities for the children through Young Ambassadors, FA Gamechangers, who have ensured that this year we offer girls' only football sessions for children as an afterschool club.
- helped organise sports events for the Enquire Learning Trust Academy trust in the Eastern hub in a range of termly sports
- improved school swim data by allocating funding to have top-up swimming sessions
- hosted an assembly with Football Freestyler, Ash Randall to give children wider sporting opportunities
- held a Bikeability course for children in Year 6 to ensure that they are able to cycle safely on the road.
- new equipment to allow children to experience new sports such as tri-golf and tennis
