<p>Timeline</p>	<p>55/54 BC – Julius Caesar leads to expedition to Britain but does not conquer</p> <p>43 AD – Emperor Claudius orders 4 legions to conquer Britain. <i>(They invaded for glory and for natural resources land, slaves, and most of all, iron, lead, zinc, copper, silver and gold)</i></p> <p>61AD – The Iceni Tribe revolt under Queen Boudicca</p> <p>100 AD – 8,000 miles of Roman roads are finished in Britain and many town now have amphitheatres, baths and other Roman buildings</p> <p>122 AD – Hadrian Wall is built</p> <p>314 AD – Christianity become legal in the Roman Empire</p> <p>407 AD – The Roman legions leave Britain to defend Rome</p> <p>410 AD – The Britain ask Rome for help against the Saxon's and Rome says to Britain: "look after your own defences" This is the end of Roman Britain.</p>	<p>Location</p>	<p>Greatest Extent of Roman Empire (117 A.D.)</p>	<p>Iter Britanniarum The Antonine Itinerary in Britain</p> <p>Legend → Station on the Itinerary --- Itinerary road 0 km 100 0 mi 50</p>
