<u>Curriculum</u>

<u>Reading</u>

Children need to read their book to develop fluency. We will change the books when needed. Children are to log their reading on the Boom Reader app to record. Children can also use reading plus at home to level up and earn their next certificate, children need to get 10 combos. A combo is earnt by scoring 80%+ on the books' comprehension questions.
