As well as this, the children will be identifying key physical and human features alongside looking at current issues such as deforestation. The children will be investigating fair trade and understanding how it affects farmers in Brazil as well as linking to the farmers in the UK and much more, how exciting!

In Science, we will be continuing with looking at plants and animals. We will be focusing on the life cycles of different animals and comparing the different gestation periods. We loved having the opportunity to have chicks in year 5 to bring our learning to life. We were amazed with how quickly they grew and the children were fascinated with the hatching process. It will be interesting to delve deeper in to this with our science lessons.

PE this half-term will be rounders, which we are sure the children are going to love. Please can we ask that all children come in PE uniform on Wednesdays and Thursdays. Also, can PE jumpers have names in so that if the children take the jumper off it is easily found as we had a couple of cases of jumpers being lost last half-term.

**Reading at home:** Reading at home is so important for reading ability, supporting spellings and writing and more! Mrs. Relton loves being able to change books and we both love to see what the children are reading at home.
