We are continuing to delve deeper this half-term to understand whether the Vikings really were vicious! The children have been extremely engaged in learning the gruesome history of the Viking raids and how they were around at the same time as the Anglo-Saxons and Mayans. We have started to look in to more detail the end of the Viking era, why this happened and who came after them. This half-term, we will also be investigating Viking settlement names, making comparisons between the Anglo-Saxons and the Vikings as well as the Viking and modern day warrior. We will also be looking at why the Vikings left.

This also ties nicely in to our Design and Technology topic of structures. We will be exploring, designing and constructing our very own Viking longhouses. The children will be experimenting with different materials and structures to find the sturdiest for their longhouse. These will be presented in our year 6 classroom and eventually be brought home by the children. Any lollipop sticks, corrugated cardboard or even straw you may have at home would be greatly appreciated by all in year 6!

We also have an interesting Science topic of Electricity. The children will be re-capping previous learning and building upon this over the next 7 weeks. We will even be creating our own personal experiment and designing our very own game using circuits and our knowledge of electricity so keep your eyes peeled on our twitter and class story to find out what we get up to. As always, knowledge organisers will be handed out to children and will be available on the school website as well as class story with this newsletter.
