We decided to have a non-uniform day to raise funds for our chosen charity – HNCO (Hajjah Naziha Organisation)



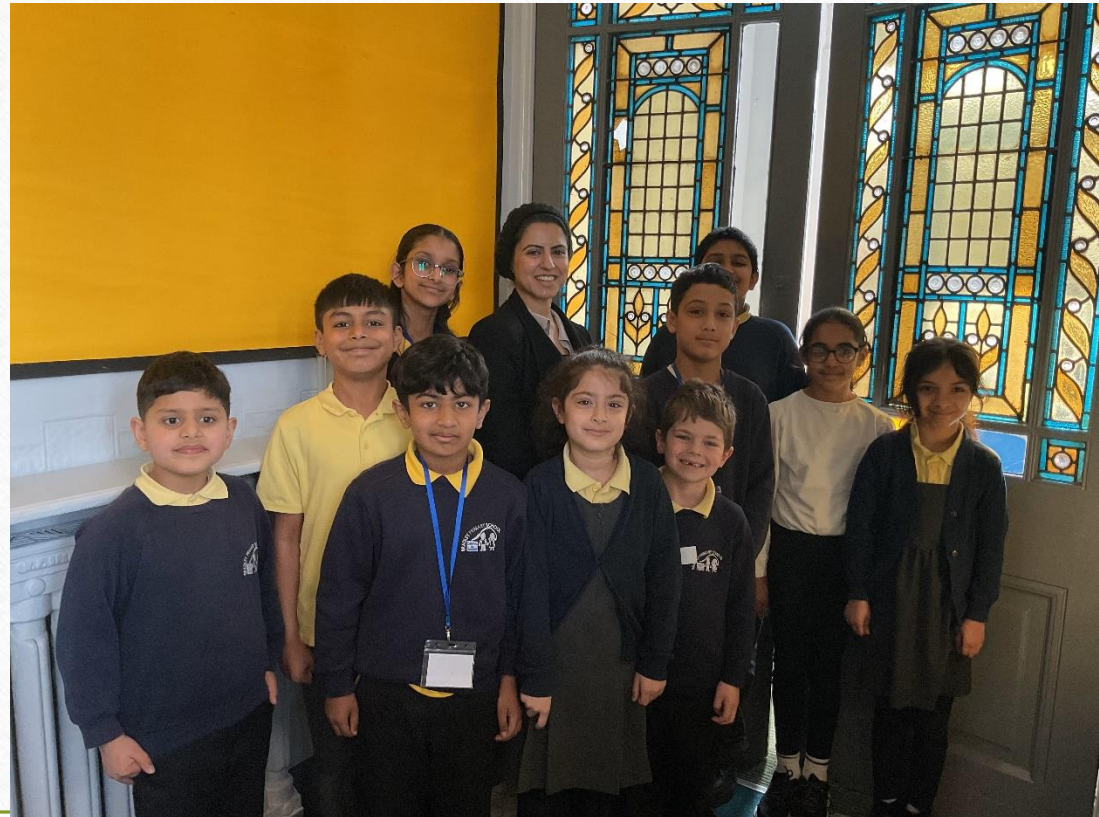
