Introduction

Bradley is a large 2 form entry primary school for children aged 4-11. We are very fortunate to have a beautiful Victorian building with spacious, bright classrooms for the children to work in. We also have an extensive hall for PE, assemblies and lunches, a fully equipped computer suite, a beautiful library, newly refurbished family room and a number of playgrounds.

The foundation stage classroom is open plan for both Early Years classes and has direct access to an enclosed outdoor learning area. Here, the children enjoy the outdoor provision which includes a mud kitchen, sand and water, building materials, an undercover play area and an area to grow things. There is also a beautiful Sunshine Room for small groups to use for learning.

All of our classrooms are well resourced and the children have access to computers and laptops to support their learning. Every classroom is equipped with an interactive whiteboard and the school has purchased a set of iPads for each year group to use.

The staffing allocation is generous and ensures an excellent staff/pupil ratio, especially in EYFS and KS1. We have a number of excellent support staff and everyone works in partnership for the benefit of the children. At lunchtime, the children are cared for by our welfare assistants and there are lunchtime clubs run by staff. Our on-site kitchen offers a choice of lunches and any allergies can be catered for.

General Information

School starts at 8:45 am. A member of staff will open the door to welcome the children on arrival.

School finishes at 3:15pm. At home time a member of staff will dismiss the children. At KS1, we will not let the children leave until a known adult collects them. We ask parents to let us know if someone different is collecting them.





















Attendance

It is important that children attend school on time and regularly if they are to achieve their full potential, Parents are asked to contact school to let us know that your child is unwell. School will contact parents if we have not had a message.

The School Staff

In addition to the Headteacher, we have a Deputy Headteacher, an Assistant Headteacher and 13 full time teachers. We are very lucky to have a full time specialist IT teacher and a full time librarian. Classes are supported by numerous teaching assistants and we have 4 office staff. Our families are supported by a dedicated Pupil Support Manager and Parental Liaison Officer.

We build strong relationships with our parents so that we can help them to help their children, through good communication and our open door policy. Our parents are very well supported by our bi-lingual staff who can translate when necessary in Punjabi, Polish or Urdu.

Breakfast Club

At Bradley we provide a very popular Breakfast Club which is run by our teaching assistants every week day. Children can come to school at 8am and enjoy a variety of breakfast choices with their friends. This ensures that the children have the best start to their day and can concentrate on their learning. The school makes a small charge for the breakfast club.

School Uniform

We are very proud of our school uniform which consists of:

Uniform for Girls

- Navy Tartan or grey pinafore or skirt
- Yellow T-shirt
- Navy cardigan or sweatshirt
- Black shoes (not trainers or boots)

In the summer months, girls may wear blue checked dresses.

- Grey school trousers (not joggers)
- Yellow T-shirt
- Navy sweatshirt
- Black school shoes (not trainers)

P.E Kit

- Plain white T-shirt
- Navy or black shorts or leggings
- Black trainers or pumps

Curriculum

Staff create a positive ethos at the school, where we endeavour to keep the children happy and expectations are high both academically and socially. Behaviour at the school is very good and the children are rewarded for good work, attendance, persistent good behaviour and effort. At the end of each half term we also have our prestigious Gold Book Award.

SEND Everyone is equal!

Every child at Bradley has the right to succeed and to play a full part in the life of the school, as well as enhancing their own life opportunities. We know every child as an individual and we know how to help them to 'Learn To Succeed'.

As well as our highly trained support staff, we access a number of external services to help individual children. We access Speech Therapists, school nurses, Specialist SEND teachers, Educational Psychologists, Visually Impaired specialist teachers and Hearing Impaired specialist teachers. We have excellent relationships with local nurseries and special schools and can access support from Pupil Referral Units. Our SENCO is highly trained and ensures that our SEND provision is targeted and effective so that the children with additional needs are given the support they need to succeed.

Extra-Curricular Opportunities

We are proud of all the different activities we offer to our children from Reception to Year 6. There is something for everyone!

Bradley Primary has 'Healthy School' and 'Eco School' status and has a Bronze Award for school Games. Our students have the opportunity to be part of many different groups, including Eco Club, School Council, Digital Leaders and a wide variety of after school clubs.

The curriculum at Bradley is enhanced by a wide range of special events and activities throughout the year, including World Book Day, Science Week, Arts Weeks, Sports Days, Theatre Groups, Music and Dance teachers and Sports Events. The choir practise every week and take part in the Let's Go Sing celebration with other schools and our Year 3 children are part of the Lancashire Linking Project. Every week we have assemblies and there are parties at different times of the year for special celebrations: Christmas and Eid.

After school, we provide reading and homework clubs, IT and Times Tables Rock Stars clubs, board games and library club and a cooking club. As for sport, there are cricket, football, golf, athletics, martial arts, rounders and gymnastics clubs available for children to access.
