Dear Parents and Carers,

It seems somewhat unreal to be saying that the last week of term is already here and 2025 is almost over. It is absolutely true that time seems to fly when you're having fun, or very busy and we certainly have been both throughout the Autumn term.

While our building has kept us busy for both exciting and frustrating reasons, our students and staff have achieved a tremendous amount, ranging from Year 7s settling into secondary school and Years 10 and 12 starting their chosen courses, to D of E expeditions and preparation for our performances of Matilda in the spring to name just a few. We are also especially impressed by the start Years 11 and 13 have made to their bug exams year; both years have had mocks this term and have tackled them with determination and confidence. Students have also participated in a range of extra curricular and enrichment activities including theatre and university visits, sports fixtures and a Design trip to Ikea.

Money raised has gone towards supporting a range of after school clubs, as well as buying a few more picnic benches to be set up in the spring. We are also looking forward to the Year 7 and 8 Disco which is being run by the PTA and Heads of Year on Thursday 18th December during lesson 4. It is unusual for a secondary school to have such an active and effective PTA, so we feel very lucky to have such a great one.
