All our learning in class this half term will be focused around the question: What makes a good global citizen?

 Grammar, punctuation and spelling activities will be an integral part of our English programme as we initially focus on sentence structure. In our lesson starters, we will revisit some key Year 3 objectives such as how to punctuate speech accurately. We will look at improving and expanding noun phrases through the use of advanced adjectives to make our writing more descriptive by either adding an adjective or replacing the noun. We will link English to our topic of locational knowledge in Europe (particularly France) through the story 'Anatole'; picking out language features. We will identify the features of a newspaper article and discuss how we can use them in our work and what purpose they serve.
