Class R September – October 2020



A very warm welcome to all of our new children, parents and carers.

We have been so impressed with how well the children have settled into their new class and we have enjoyed all the activity sessions we have shared with the children. We are looking forward to an exciting Autumn in Class R!

Communication, Language and Literacy

- The focus will be 'Ourselves'. The children will talk about themselves and their families. We will be reading a range of fiction and non-fiction books linked to change, school and families.
- The children will be learning a traditional story each term using a story map and actions. This term the children will be learning the story 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'.
- The children will join in circle times with their key worker where they will share their thoughts, take turns and listen to one another's ideas.
- All children will start to read to an adult both in group reading sessions and individually.

Writing:

- All children will be learning Phase 2 sounds and will begin to form letters and simple words. They will practise this in the areas of provision and during fun focused activities.
- All children will participate in handwriting sessions with a focus on **accurate letter formation**. This may be in shaving foam, sand, paint or handwriting books.

How can I help / information for helping

Practise writing letters using the correct starting point and formation, especially in their name. Ask your child to write all the sounds they can hear in a word. Can they hear the initial sound?

Discuss vocabulary with your child when reading stories at night time.


If your child requires a little extra support ask your child to create their name or words using cut up letters to remove the pressure of writing.

Mathematical Development

- The focus will be on numbers 1, 2 and 3.
- We will learn 1 more and 1 less practically than a given number up to 3.
- We will learn to subitise using groups of objects up to 3.
- We will learn number bonds to 3 (1 and 2 makes 3, 3 and 0 makes 3)
- We will learn to explain our answers by using 'because'. We will model how to challenge answers by using 'I agree' or 'I disagree'.
- The children will look at shapes that have 1/ 2/ 3 sides, faces, points or corners.
- We will explore measuring including capacity using a range of equipment.
- The children will explore patterns using a range of objects.

<p>Focus is: Phase 2 sounds</p>  <p>This term the children will begin to learn Phase 2 sounds. They will learn to blend and segment simple CV (it) and CVC (bat) words when reading and writing. The children will spend time settling in to the new routines of school with their key worker and the other members of staff. • They will spend time getting to know the names of the other children in the class. • The children will create their own set of classroom rules in order to make the classroom a happy and safe place, these will be linked to the British Values. • In Class R we have a ‘VIP of the Day’ system. Each day we will choose two children who have excelled themselves in class to be our ‘VIPs of the Day.’ Parents will be informed on tapestry if their child is V.I.P. The VIPs will wear a celebratory lanyard and will be in charge of special jobs in class. • The children will participate in Celebration Assembly every Thursday in class where we celebrate a special person in our class. If your child has been chosen as the ‘Star of the Week’ you will be informed on Tapestry a week before and then a short video will be shared with you on tapestry on the day, where your child will receive a special certificate in front of the whole class. 	<p>Focus is: In PE the focus will be travelling safely around a large space outside in a variety of ways with control and coordination.</p> <p>Skills / knowledge to be developed: In the outdoor area the children will have the opportunity to develop gross motor skills and to be physically active. We will provide a range of resources each week to develop skills such as the obstacle course, bats and balls, large building equipment etc.</p> <p>We will provide exciting fine motor activities within the classroom for the children to access. These will help the children improve their pencil control.</p> <p>PE will be on a Wednesday morning. Therefore please can you ensure your child comes to school in their P.E kit. They will then remain in their kit for the duration of the day. Please make sure your child wears warm clothing in case it is cold.</p> <p>The first P.E lesson will take place on Wednesday 30th September, which will be the first day that they can wear their P.E. kits to school.</p>

<p>Reading Over the next few weeks, your child will receive their first reading book to share with you at home. Initially each child will start by taking a book home with no words. Once your child starts to blend sounds together at school they will begin to take one or two books home each week with words. Books will be sent home each Thursday and collected in every Monday morning. Therefore, your child will have their book from Thursday to Monday at home. We will ensure whilst your child is at school that they read at least twice a week to an adult. Please make sure you write in your child's Reading Record book each time you hear them read. There will be a box placed by the reception shed for you to place your child's book in every Monday morning.</p> <p>English Homework A sound book will be sent home soon for your child to practise their sound recognition and formation.
