## Bramham Shadwell Federation Class 1 November – December 2024



English	Maths
<ul> <li>We are starting the new Read Write Inc Scheme in Year 1 for phonics, reading and writing.</li> <li>The children are grouped in order to promote progress and confidence in all three areas.</li> <li>In phonics, the children will be learning new Set 3 sounds as well as consolidating Set 2 sounds.</li> <li>In reading, the groups will have a new focus book every three days. They will learn to decode (Fred Talk) new green words and recap red words which are in the book. The children will read the books each day for fluency and answer comprehension questions at the end of the three day cycle. This half term, we are working on expression when speech or exclamation marks are used in the story.</li> <li>In writing, the children will write about the book they are reading.</li> <li>The children will continue to be encouraged to apply their phonics knowledge to spelling, use capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. There is a particular focus on writing and uplevelling a simple sentence. This could be with adjectives or more adventurous verbs. Word classes are to be taught to the children this half term as it scaffolds their understanding of what makes a coherent sentence.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>This half term the children will be moving onto numbers to 20.</li> <li>They will count and write to 20, compare and order numbers, and see patterns within 20.</li> <li>The children have a strong focus on place value, recognising, for example, what the '1' and the '5' in '15' signify.</li> <li>Correct numeral formation will continue, particularly with numbers 3, 5 and 9.</li> <li>They will continue to use ten frames and the partpart-whole model to solve problems and check their answers.</li> <li>Later in the half term, we will move onto shapes and patterns, and height and length.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>How can I help / information for helping?</li> <li>For phonics, they could hunt for sounds they have learnt in their books.</li> <li>Listen to your child read every day. Read to your child and discuss the book.</li> <li>Ask 'fastest finger questions' where they must find a word our section of the text on each page.</li> <li>Ask 'have a think questions' where they must infer something about the text. Discuss punctuation such as full stops, question marks, exclamation marks and speech marks.</li> <li>Encourage your children to write their own stories about the books they are reading, a topic they are interested in or our new topic on 'Space'.</li> <li>We learnt about instructions last half term so follow a set of instructions when cooking to consolidate their learning in this.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>How can I help / information for helping?</li> <li>Count objects to 20 with your child – for example, can they reliably count out up to 20 objects from a group, or tell you how many books are on the shelf? If they are writing numbers at home, show them the correct number formation.</li> <li>Sing counting songs together.</li> </ul>

How can I help / information for helping? Can anyone in your family remember the moon landing? Discuss and share memories with your child. Look at the sky at night – what shape is the moon? Do you know any of the stars or planets?	How can I help / information for helping? Discuss the parts of the human body and how they work. Challenge the children by using less common terms – can you touch your earlobe? Where are your kidneys? Discuss the 5 senses and talk about what you can see, smell, taste, feel and hear. Spot birds and animals in your garden or at the park. Talk about the animals that you see in books or on the television.	How can I help / information for helping? The children should continue to come to school in their outdoor PE kit on Thursdays. Please ensure that your child's kit is appropriate for the colder weather.
