Bramham Shadwell Federation Class 1 November – December 2020



All our learning in class this half term will be focused around the question: 'How did people in the past protect themselves?'			
English	Maths		
 Class One will be using 'Space Poems' as their text. They will be writing their own Space counting poems and exploring a range of different poetry. Throughout the term we will continue to develop our skills for self-assessment in writing by checking each sentence for a capital letter, clear finger spaces and full stops. The children will be encouraged to up-level their sentences by using a variety of adjectives and joining words. In phonics we will be introducing the phase 5 digraphs. These are alternative spellings for sounds the children have already learnt in Phase 3. 	 This half term the children will be continuing to consolidate their understanding of addition and subtraction within 10. They will be making up their own number stories and solving picture problems to aid their learning. They will continue to use ten frames and the part part whole model to solve problems and check their answers. We will then be moving onto numbers to 20, both counting and writing. The children will be looking at place value, recognising, for example, what the '1' and the '5' in '15' signify. They will be using their knowledge of number bonds to 10 to solve addition and subtraction problems within 20. Correct numeral formation will continue to be a focus. We will also be investigating positional language. 		

 How can I help / information for Helping Encourage your children to read and talk about a range of different poems, including song lyrics. When reading books with your child, ask them to find the beginning and end of a sentence on a page. Can they point to a word? Can they point to a letter? Discuss punctuation such as full stops, question marks, exclamation marks and speech marks.
