School Development Planning—Strategic Vision

All schools have to decide where they need to develop their curriculum / staff / provision for children and in this way, a School Development Plan is formed; this is usually data-driven and is formed based on end of Key Stage results. In Bramham Primary School, we achieved our best ever KS2 SATs results last year, officially ranking in the top 20% of all schools nationally for Maths and Reading and in the top 40% for Writing. Writing has been highlighted nationally as an area whereby the (new in 2015) National Curriculum expectations have exceeded those which had previously been taught. This is a good thing; it raises standards however it does mean that children, having been taught the previous curriculum in school, have had some gaps in their knowledge and the data nationally demonstrates this. In Bramham Primary School we have worked relentlessly to 'close the gaps' for children; your child may currently be part of an intervention group; a booster group; a Boys' Writing Club and/or may take home some additional homework on occasion.

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School Development Planning—Strategic Vision (Continued)

We have 5 Major Intentions within our School Development Plan this year:

To target WRITING throughout the Federation to ensure good progress is made from KS1 to end of KS2.

This is with a particular focus on the achievement of our boys—our data demonstrates that girls tend to perform slightly better than boys in writing—this tends to be a national trend. Last year we held a highly successful 'Men Behaving Dadly' which inspired and motivated both boys and girls in their reading and writing. Please do be in touch if you would like to participate again in something similar this year; the children loved the day and we saw an impact into boys' reading and their engagement with texts which was truly inspiring!



To continue to develop SITE (Science / Innovation / Technology / Engineering) within the Federation for a unique, reinvigorated and integrated approach to the delivery of Science, Computing, Innovation and DT across the Federation.



This bespoke and innovative development in our curriculum will allow our teachers to plan exciting and innovative lessons which cover several aspects of the curricu-We lum through a topic-based approach. The topic will be inspiring and engaging for the children and the development of SITE has already facilitated many exciting links

with our community and parents who have professions linked to Science, Innovation, Technology and Engineering. If you feel you could contribute to our curriculum in sharing your expertise, please do not hesitate to be in touch with Mrs Kirby (Bramham) or Mr Rugg (Shadwell) - we would welcome your contribution!

To continue the development of Personal, Social, Health Education (PSHE) and the integration of meaningful Social, Moral, Spiritual and Cultural links (SMSC), including British Values and Social, Emotional Mental Health (SEMH) across the Federation, impacting on day to day learning and living and developing our ethos and family culture across the Federation.

It is required by law that our children are in receipt of quality PSHE teaching; that SMSC is a thread running

through all aspects of our curriculum and that we become increasingly aware of SEMH (in a response to national data and statistics for mental health). In our Federation, we have, through the School Development Plan and through skilful planning and collaboration, designed lessons and planning which engages SMSC on a daily basis (you will note our 'Ethos Statements' throughout school and tweeted to all parents on a Monday-these are integral to SMSC learning.) We are currently working as a Federation to being 'Mindmate' accredited in acknowledgment of the SEMH work done for our children.



To engage further with meaningful curricular links and purposeful learning to ENRICH learning across the Federation.



This objective overlaps with the three areas outlined above; incorporating SITE with Writing and SMSC into all areas of the curriculum so that all aspects of the curriculum can be taught through a topic. The theme of our Topics will be 'Freedom' next term.

To continue to increase further CAPACITY within the Federation, fostering a culture for leadership, responsibility and accountability through subject development and to continue to nurture and teach new staff, ensuring their development in the

provision of 'Excellence for All'.

Through training and in developing our staff, we build capacity and capability. Most teachers are responsible for a subject area however all staff are members of a curriculum team and in turn, their knowledge and expertise ensures all children have access to excellence in teaching and learning. We have a highly skilled and dedicated

team within the Federation and all teachers are held accountable on a termly basis for every child's progress. The Executive Head Teacher and the Executive Deputy meet with each teacher on a termly basis to discuss provision and progress for your child; together they scrutinise work, books, data and hold pupil discussions. In this way, you can be assured that every child is receiving the very best and their education is being catered very specifically to meet their needs.

All schools have a statutory duty to publish specific information on their websites and as you know, over the last year, our websites are brand new—they have been fully updated and re-written. The Bramham Shadwell Federation has 12 Governors. Our Governors are selected through the Local Authority and by the Governing body based on their skills, knowledge and understanding. They are each allocated to a sub-committee and support the Head Teacher in leading the strategic direction of the school (including monitoring of the School Development Plan).

The Governors meet regularly as full and sub-committees to check compliance and statutory obligation for:

- Teaching and Learning
- Finance (including budgets and Health and Safety compliance)
- Pupil Support
- Strategic planning

Our Governors are regularly in school and talk with our children to discuss and feedback their opinions about new initiatives or procedures that happen in school.

Trail-Blazing in the Bramham Shadwell Federation

In the Bramham Shadwell Federation, we are not only able to provide excellence to our children and families within Bramham and Shadwell Primary Schools, we also are very proud of the work we do to support education and children's well-being on a larger scale, leading the way within the Local Authority and supporting other schools and children in their academic and personal achievements:

Did you Know?

We are leading in Maths: Bramham Primary School (as part of the Federation) has been part of several new maths initiatives: we host the Leeds Learning Partnership (LLP) for Maths Mastery and Problem Solving for the Local Authority. Our Lead Practitioner is a Maths Mastery specialist. Hosting the LLP involves leading teacher research groups, drawing teachers from within the Federation and other schools in the Leeds region for development in Maths Mastery. We are at the forefront of developing Maths Mastery in the country and the impact of this development can be seen in our Maths results and the depth with which children are beginning to understand Maths.

We are leading in Leadership: The Executive Head Teacher is currently coaching/supporting other Head Teachers within the Local Authority with specific input around mirroring the outstanding SMSC/ SEMH provision within the Federation and in Learning Alliance work in sharing exemplary practice in rigorous performance Management and management structures. The Executive Head teacher is also the Head Teacher representative for the Joint Collaborative Committee for our group of North Leeds Schools in determining support schools receive.

We are leading in Support for Children: The Executive HT also takes a wider interest in the children from the 'Elmete' (part of North Leeds) region and has been asked to represent all schools in this area as part of the RES (Social Care) team. The RES team plan strategic advancements in Social Care expenditure to benefit the community and local schools. Our Federation hosts a termly 'Social Care Surgery' for our Social Care team and all Head Teachers in the area in developing effective protocols and systems between schools and provision for children in need of support.

We are leading in English: Our school has developed a progressive Grammar planning document which has broken down areas of the new National Curriculum to ensure clear progression for children throughout school. This document has been used as exemplary practice throughout the LA and is available for parents to use on the website. It continues to be a key planning tool for staff and, along with a focus on spelling, is gradually assisting teachers in closing the gap in writing.

We are leading in the Quality of our Work: KS2, KS1 and EYFS were moderated in Bramham (2016, 2017, 2016 respectively); Leeds Authority KS1 and EYFS Moderation training has requested and used *our* children's work for *their* sharing of exemplary practice throughout the city and with this, various other schools moderate with our school for writing.

We are leading in Sports Provision: This academic year, we are working towards achieving Healthy Schools Status for Bramham Primary; we were very proud that Bramham Primary achieved Schools Games Gold Award at the end of last academic year.
