All our learning in class this half term will be focused around the question: Keeping Safe		
Communication, Language and Literacy	Mathematical Development	
<ul> <li>Mark making:</li> <li>All children will be learning Phase 2 and 3 sounds and will begin to practise writing letters and simple words. They will practise this in the areas of provision and during fun focused activities.</li> <li>All children will continue to participate in handwriting sessions with a focus on accurate letter formation. This may be in shaving foam, sand, and paint or in their books.</li> <li>Literacy: <ul> <li>We will begin this half term with a focus on Bonfire night and staying safe. We will be writing words linked to bonfire night.</li> <li>The children will be writing Christmas lists, cards and a letter to Santa.</li> <li>The children will be retelling the Christmas story through role-play, song and dance. There will be lots of opportunity for the class to discuss the setting, characters, problem and the resolution.</li> </ul> </li> <li>As always we will follow children's interests, so keep an eye on the class website for any new topics we may launch!</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Number Focus: <ul> <li>This term we will continue to develop the children's understanding of numbers and counting through specifically focussing on one number at a time. This term we will be exploring the numbers 3,4 and 5.</li> <li>We will focus on patterns within the numbers using a range of resources as it is proven that an understanding of pattern is key for children's mathematical development.</li> <li>We will practise counting irregular groups of objects and recognising numbers to 5.</li> <li>Children will explore how to solve mathematical problems involving more and less, as well as calculating which two numbers make a given total using objects/ numicon plates.</li> <li>Doubling, halving and sharing will also be touched upon.</li> <li>Shape will be taught alongside number. The children will be encoraged to decribe and name 2D and 3D shapes in everyday objects. For example, a rectangle has two long sides and two short sides: 2 and 2 makes 4. What happens if you cut a square in half? How many sides do two squares have? How could you find out?</li> </ul></li></ul>	
<ul> <li>How can I help / information for helping</li> <li>Practice writing letters using the correct starting point and formation.</li> <li>Ask your child to write all the sounds they can hear in a word. Can they hear the initial sound?</li> <li>Discuss vocabulary with your child when reading stories at night time.</li> <li>Practise accurate letter formation</li> <li>If your child is writing at home, please encourage them to start their letters in the correct place.</li> </ul>	How can I help / information for Helping Spot numbers and shapes with your child in your local environment	

Phonics	Personal, Social & Emotional Development	Physical Development
Focus is: Phase 2 and 3         This term the children will consolidate their knowledge of Phase 2 sounds. They will continue to blend and segment simple VC (it, on) and CVC (cat, dog) words when reading and writing words. The children will begin to learn the phase 3 sounds below.         Image: Constraint of the phase 3 sounds a sound 3 s	<ul> <li>Focus is: Getting to know my key worker.</li> <li>Children will regularly participate in circle time with their key worker group to discuss current issues, play games and to take turns listening to one another.</li> <li>We will focus with the children on staying safe through our topic on 'Keeping safe'.</li> <li>The children will think about being safe on the darker nights as well as being safe on Bonfire night.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Focus is: Gymnastics</li> <li>Skills / knowledge to be developed: <ul> <li>The children will be creating shapes using their bodies.</li> <li>They will be moving safely on and around apparatus.</li> <li>The children will learn to perform the tuck, straddle and pike positions on apparatus or mats.</li> </ul> </li> <li>We will provide exciting fine motor activities within the classroom for the children to access. These will help the children improve their pencil control.</li> <li>PE will be on a Monday this half term.</li> <li>This term the children will be practicing getting ready for outdoor play independently. Can you please help them to learn how to zip up their coat and put on their gloves?</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>How can I help / information for Helping</li> <li>Identify new phase 3 sounds when out and about.</li> <li>Sing the Jolly Phonics songs and practise the actions at home (These can be found on YouTube or can be purchased).</li> <li>Practice recognition of these tricky words.</li> <li>Practice writing the first 6 tricky words.</li> <li>Keep working on blending and segmenting simple words at home e.g. c-a-tcat.</li> </ul>	How can I help / information for Helping If you have any concerns about your child, please let us know.	<ul> <li>How can I help / information for Helping</li> <li>Please ensure that your child has their named indoor</li> <li>PE kit including pumps with them every day which can be taken home on a Friday to wash if necessary, as additional lessons may take place on alternative days.</li> <li>Please continue to encourage your child to get dressed by themselves each morning, as this will help support them to get changed for P.E.</li> </ul>

Expressive Arts and Design	Understanding the World
<ul> <li>Focus is: Festivals</li> <li>This term the children will have the opportunity to engage in lots of imaginative play. The home corner is going to be turned into a Grotto and possibly other role-play areas depending on the children's interests.</li> <li>Paints, writing materials and construction equipment are available every day and will continue to be enhanced during specific weeks.</li> <li>Key skills will be targeted such as paint mixing, cutting and split pins to encourage independence later in the year.</li> <li>The children will participate in a singing and movement lesson each week with Mrs Crowley. This will take place each Friday afternoon.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Focus is: Festivals</li> <li>Initially we will look at Bonfire night and will learn how to stay safe.</li> <li>We will be looking at people who help us and will have a visit from Blue Watch Fire Service.</li> <li>We will look at different festivals including Diwali and Christmas and we will think about how people celebrate these festivals.</li> <li>We will be writing letters to Santa and going to the local post box to send them.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>How can I help / information for Helping</li> <li>Please bring in small boxes, lids and containers for the children to use in our workshop area.</li> <li>Thank you to those who have contributed to our baking fund. The children really do enjoy these activities and learn a great deal whilst taking part in them. If you could contribute £5 so we can continue these activities with the children it would be greatly appreciated.</li> </ul>	How can I help / information for Helping Talk to your children about staying safe especially focusing on road safety in the winter months.
