## **Bramham Shadwell Federation** Class 1 January-February 2022



All our learning in class this half term will be focused around the question: 'What does freedom mean to someone'			
English	Maths		
<ul> <li>This half term the children will be trying their hand and writing an adventure story. They will start by learning the Oliver Jeffers story 'Lost and Found' using a story map before changing their characters and settings and writing their own 'Lost and Found' stories.</li> <li>We will continue to focus on using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops in sentences but will also introduce the children to using exclamation marks and question marks in their writing.</li> <li>The children will also be learning to use the "ed" suffix correctly.</li> <li>Children will learn how to use the conjunction 'and' to extend their sentences and thoughts further.</li> <li>We will continue to practise the spelling of Year 1 high frequency words.</li> <li>In Phonics children will finish learning the additional RWI sounds and consolidating their known sounds and blending skills through daily speed sound and storybook sessions,</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>The children will be continuing to explore numbers to 20</li> <li>We will be solving addition and subtraction problems within 20 using a range of strategies, including counting on and back, making 10 and adding and subtracting ones.</li> <li>The children will continue to develop their mental maths skills, specifically number bonds to 20.</li> <li>They will build upon their knowledge of place value to aid their mental addition and subtraction skills.</li> <li>We will also be investigating length and height</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>How can I help / information for helping</li> <li>Continue to share and enjoy books with your children at home. Discuss the language used by the author and look at the punctuation – are there any exclamation marks or question marks?</li> <li>Have a 'word of the week' – something new to your child, which they have come across in a book.
