Primary P.E. and Sport Premium



The aim of the P.E. Premium funding is to improve the quality and breadth of P.E. and sport provision whilst increasing the participation and enjoyment of all pupils in P.E. and sport; the funding is 'ring-fenced' and can therefore only be spent on achieving these goals. Bramham Primary received in total **£17,450.00** for the 2019-2020 academic year. This year the money has also been able to be carried over into the 2020-2021 academic year because of the Covid-19 pandemic as there was not the opportunity to use all of the funding. Both Bramham and Shadwell have their own allocation and must therefore use their own funding for their own pupils.

At Bramham and Shadwell Federation we are proud of the continually increasing opportunities we provide all of our pupils; our P.E. team, led by Mr Brotherton, who has the responsibility of developing P.E. and Sport across both schools and we are excited about the future of P.E. and sport within the Federation. The funding helps us to facilitate our goals and the following document details the impact of some of the funding for the 2019-2020 academic year at Bramham Primary School.
