This term Reception will be learning all about Winter and Dinosaurs.

If your child requires extra challenge: Continue 2D shapes. Can they name them and describe their properties? Could your child write a word containing the sound or write a sentence containing the word.

Challenge: Explore the value of money. How many different ways can you pay for a toy that

costs 4p/5p? If you paid with a 10p, how much change would you get back?
