This term Reception will be continuing to travel the seven continents. We will be visiting South America, North America and Europe.

Communication, Language and Literacy	Mathematical Development		
 We will be using a range of fiction and nonfiction texts linked to various countries around the world. The children will be retelling stories through story maps, speech bubbles and story writing. We will focus on the 5 Success Criteria: To say our sentence out loud, capital letters, finger spaces, full stops and forming our letters correctly. All children will continue to read to an adult both in group reading sessions and individually. We will also be further developing our story telling skills, which will help, develop our writing. The children will create a class story that the teacher will scribe in a whole class book. This will encourage story language and a deeper understanding of the elements, which are required to make a story: beginning, setting, characters, problem and resolution. 	 The focus will be on recognising and ordering numbers up to 10. They will continue to develop their quick recall of 1 more and 1 less than a given number. The children will continue to use the part part whole model, ten frames and numicon to explore number bonds up to 10. This will help develop their understanding of partitioning. The children will be able to say what the parts are and what the whole is e.g. 2 is a part, 3 is a part, 5 is the whole. 		
The texts we will focus on are: The Very Hungry Caterpillar, The 7 Continents, The Easter Story	 The children will recognise and describe properties of 3D shapes. The children will also continue to develop their recording skills using mathematical graphics. They will be encouraged to explain what they have done.

Ask questions to check your child's understanding of the book they have read. Practise accurate letter formation When your child is writing at home, please encourage them to start their letters in the correct place. The children will apply their phonic skills when writing two-syllable words, captions and short sentences. Tricky words: The children will continue to learn how to write the phase 2 tricky words, I, go, to, no, the, into and the phase 3 tricky words he, she, we, me, be, was. Children will also be learning to read the phase 3 tricky words they, all, are, my, her, you High Frequency Words: First 100 high frequency word list precursive (highfrequencywords.org)	This term the children will carry out a circle time each week. Circle times are linked to the weekly ethos statement. This term the 'Class R VIP of the Day' system will continue. Each day we will choose two children to be our 'YIPs' and parents will be informed. They will be in charge of special jobs in class. Celebration Assembly will continue to take place every Friday. A 'Star of the Week' will be chosen and then posted on Tapestry.	Focus is: Games Skills / knowledge to be developed: The children will develop their throwing and catching skills. They will learn to bounce a ball. The children will learn to play small sided games using a ball. They will develop the ability to control a ball in a range of ways. Exciting fine motor activities will be provided within the classroom for the children to access. These will help the children improve their pencil control. PE will be on a Wednesday this half term.

 Focus is: Continents/ landmarks/ rainforest The children will use a range of medium to create pictures and models. The children will be creating a classroom rain forest using a range of skills and materials. The children will also be using paint, chalk and drawing pencils to create drawings of famous landmarks. The children will be encouraged to use their drawing skills to create observational drawings of the changes they notice happening in spring. The children will continue to have music sessions with Mrs Crowley our specialist teacher on a Thursday afternoon. 	 Explore and investigate where in the world is the world's biggest rain forest. The children will learn about the different creatures that live in the Amazon. The children will learn about life cycles of a butterfly and frog. The children will observe signs of spring and discuss seasonal changes. The children will learn about the Easter Story.
