Summer 1 Class R April- May 2022



This term the children will be learning all about real life and fictional Superheroes and will be looking at books by the author Julia Donaldson.

Communication, Language and Literacy

- We will be focusing on Superheroes; both fictional and real life.
- We will be looking at stories written by the author Julia Donaldson.
- The children will be retelling stories through the use of story maps and sequencing pictures as well as story writing.
- The children will write character descriptions.
- We will focus on the 4 Success Criteria: To say our sentence out loud, capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.
- All children will continue to read to an adult both in group reading sessions and individually.
- We will also be further developing our story telling skills which will help develop our writing. The children will create a class story that the teacher will scribe in a whole class book. This will encourage story language and a deeper understanding of the elements which are required to make a story: beginning, setting, characters, problem and resolution.

The texts we will focus on are:

Superworm, Supertato, What the Ladybird Heard.

How can I help / information for helping

Share a variety of books at home with your child.
Discuss vocabulary with your child from their reading book. Ask questions to check your child's understanding of the book they have read.

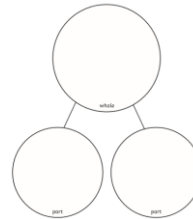
Practise accurate letter formation

When your child is writing at home, please encourage them to start their letters in the correct place.

Accurate number formation of numbers to 10.

Mathematical Development

- The focus will be on numbers 8 and 9.
- The children will explore number bonds to 9 using their subitising skills.
- The children will continue to use the part part whole model and the ten frames to explore number bonds up to 9. This will help develop their understanding of partitioning.



The children will be able to say what the parts are and what the whole is e.g. 7 is a part, 2 is a part, 9 is the whole.

- The children will recognise coins up to 10p and solve simple problems involving money.
- The children will continue to develop their counting skills and make sure they can count objects accurately and reliably.
- The children will confidently say 1 less than a number.
- The children will also continue to develop their recording skills using mathematical graphics. They will be encouraged to explain what they have done.

How can I help / information for Helping

Practise saying 1 less than a given number to 10 and beyond.

Sorting coins.

Subitising when out and about – how many flowers/ trees can you see in that group? How many sheep/ cows?

1 minute maths app to help your child to build greater number confidence and fluency. It's all about targeted practice in engaging, one-minute chunks! Please follow the link provided to download the app.

This is a great chance for children to discuss and share their emotions and feelings</p> <p>This term the 'Class R VIP of the Day' system will continue. Each day we will choose two children to be our 'VIPs' and parents will be informed. They will be in charge of special jobs in class.</p> <p>We are pleased that our Special Assembly will now take place in school! This will be at 9.15am every Friday morning and you will be invited the week before if your child has been chosen.</p>	<p>Focus is:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Gymnastics and ball games <p>Skills / knowledge to be developed:</p> <p>The children will continue to work on creating shapes using their bodies. They will be moving safely on and around the apparatus. The children will continue to develop their ball skills.</p> <p>Exciting fine motor activities will be provided within the classroom for the children to access. These will help the children improve their pencil control.</p> <p>PE will be on a Wednesday this half term.</p>

Practise recognition of all our tricky words. Can they get dressed independently in the morning? Can they use a knife and fork correctly?</p>

Expressive Arts and Design	Understanding the World
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The children will be looking at the work of the artist Jackson Pollock and will create art work using the 'drip technique.' The children will continue to use a range of medium to create pictures and models. The children will retell traditional stories using role play, puppetry and through small world. <p>The children will continue to have singing and music sessions with a specialised teacher on a Thursday.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The children will discuss seasonal changes with a particular focus on growing. The children will plant and care for potatoes, lettuces and radishes. The children will also harvest the garlic that they have previously planted. The children will take part in bird watching. The children will look for worms in the outdoor classroom. The children will continue to follow the recipe to make play-dough each week with the aim that they will be able to make play-dough independently by the end of the academic year.
